SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Economic and Community Development Department for Oregon Arts Commission.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from lottery moneys for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds for certain purposes.

Authorizes certain nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to financial administration of the Economic and Community Development Department; appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> There is appropriated to the Economic and Community Development Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$4,709,470 for the Oregon Arts Commission.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Economic and Community Development Department, for the following purposes:

- (1) Business, Innovation, and Trade\$ 14,712,770
- (2) Infrastructure Financing...... \$ 7,124,488
- (3) Shared Services...... \$ 2,103,106
- 16 (4) Arts and Cultural Trust \$ 6,496,665
- 17 **(5) Debt Service...... \$ 2,042,782**

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Economic and Community Development Department, for the following purposes:

(1) Business, Innovation, and Trade\$ 33,099,973
