SUMMARY

SECTION 2. The Legislative Assembly approves the proposal of the Oregon Military De partment, submitted in accordance with ORS 396.515 (4), for the sale of the Dallas, Oregon,
Armory and 0.34 acres of land upon which it is situated.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 28expenditures for the Camp Withycombe Reserve Center established by section 1 (9)(b), 2930 chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maxi-31 mum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the 32Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, con-33 34 structing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities is decreased by \$897,432. 35

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures for the Camp Withycombe Reserve Center established by section 2 (1)(b), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities is increased by \$21,470,584.

42 <u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 43 expenditures for the Ontario Readiness Center established by section 1 (9)(a), chapter 742, 44 Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for 45 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,

<u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$87,134 is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the design and construction of phase two of the Weapons of Mass Destruction/102 Civil Support Team Facility project.

29 <u>SECTION 10.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 30 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 31 on its passage.
