

# HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5034

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, delete “appropriating money;” and insert “creating new provisions;  
2 amending section 16, chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2009 (Enrolled Senate Bill 338);”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 18 and insert:

4 “**SECTION 1.** Section 16, chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2009 (Enrolled Senate Bill 338), is amended  
5 to read:

6 “**Sec. 16.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are es-  
7 tablished for the [biennium] **four-year period** beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for  
8 payment of expenses under this section from bond proceeds collected or received by the Department  
9 of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for community college districts for deferred  
10 maintenance, capital renewal, code compliance and safety projects:

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9 **“SECTION 2.** The Legislative Assembly approves the proposal of the Oregon Military  
10 Department, submitted in accordance with ORS 396.515 (4), for the sale of the Dallas, Oregon,  
11 Armory and 0.34 acres of land upon which it is situated.

12 **“SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
13 expenditures for the Camp Withycombe Reserve Center established by section 1 (9)(b),  
14 chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maxi-  
15 mum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscel-  
16 laneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the  
17 Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, con-  
18 structing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities is decreased  
19 by \$897,432.

20 **“SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
21 expenditures for the Camp Withycombe Reserve Center established by section 2 (1)(b),  
22 chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maxi-  
23 mum limit for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military  
24 Department for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering,  
25 repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities is increased by \$21,470,584.

26 **“SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
27 expenditures for the Ontario Readiness Center established by section 1 (9)(a), chapter 742,  
28 Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for  
29 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,  
30 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military  
31 Department for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering,  
32 repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities is increased by \$897,432.

33 **“SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on  
34 expenditures for the Newport Armory Addition/Alteration established by section 1 (9)(e),  
35 chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maxi-  
36 mum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscel-  
37 laneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the  
38 Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, con-  
39 structing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities is decreased  
40 by \$1,506,479.

41 **“SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
42 \$1,506,479 is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit  
43 for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-  
44 cepts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon  
45 Military Department for the acquisition of 10.95 acres of land in Dallas, Oregon, for the

1 eventual construction of a new Dallas Readiness Center to replace the existing Dallas Ar-  
2 mory.

3 **“SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of  
4 **\$3,726,944** is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit  
5 **for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department**  
6 **for the planning, design and construction of phase two of the Salem Army Aviation Support**  
7 **Facility project.**

8 **“SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of **\$87,134**  
9 **is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the**  
10 **expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the**  
11 **design and construction of phase two of the Weapons of Mass Destruction/102 Civil Support**  
12 **Team Facility project.**

13 **“SECTION 10.** This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
14 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect**  
15 **on its passage.”.**

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
