House Bill 5049

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board to allocate moneys deposited into Watershed Improvement Operating Fund and Watershed Improvement Grant Fund to various state agencies to implement section 4 (10), Article XV of Oregon Constitution.

Limits biennial expenditures of board from federal funds and lottery funds.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by board for agency operations related to Oregon Plan.

Directs board to establish by rule process for allocating available moneys in Restoration and Protection Subaccount of Parks and Natural Resources Fund. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

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Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

5 SECTION 1. Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Operating Fund

established under ORS 541.379, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate 6 \$5,494,658 to the Department of State Police for fish and wildlife activities to implement 7

section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution. 8

9 SECTION 2. Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Operating Fund established under ORS 541.379, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate 10 \$5,241,745 to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife for activities and projects to imple-11

12 ment section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution.

13 SECTION 3. Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Operating Fund established under ORS 541.379, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate 14 \$4,340,230 to the State Department of Agriculture for activities and projects to implement 1516 section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution.

SECTION 4. Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Operating Fund 1718 established under ORS 541.379, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate \$6,056,344 to the Department of Environmental Quality for activities and projects to imple-19 ment section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution. 20

21SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$16,407,566 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for 22 23payment of expenses by the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board from lottery moneys 24 deposited into the Watershed Improvement Operating Fund established under ORS 541.379, for operating expenses, activities and projects to implement section 4 (10), Article XV of the 2526 **Oregon Constitution.**

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1 <u>SECTION 6.</u> Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Grant Fund es-2 tablished under ORS 541.397, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate 3 \$4,686,103 to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife for expenses of implementing section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution.

5 <u>SECTION 7.</u> Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Grant Fund established under ORS 541.397, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate \$583,052 to the Department of State Police for expenses of implementing section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution.

9 <u>SECTION 8.</u> Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Grant Fund es-10 tablished under ORS 541.397, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate 11 \$5,088,642 to the State Department of Agriculture for activities and projects to implement 12 section 4 (10), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> Of the moneys deposited into the Watershed Improvement Grant Fund es tablished under ORS 541.397, the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall allocate
\$100,000 to the Water Resources Department for expenses of implementing section 4 (10),
Article XV of the Oregon Constitution.

17 <u>SECTION 10.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 18 \$8,900,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for 19 payment of expenses from lottery funds collected or received by the Oregon Watershed En-20 hancement Board from the Restoration and Protection Research Fund established under 21 ORS 541.378.

<u>SECTION 11.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$20,206,181 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses for agency operations related to Oregon Plan activities from federal funds collected or received by the Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board.

26 <u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 27 \$2,136,718 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for 28 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, 29 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Watershed 30 Enhancement Board for agency operations related to Oregon Plan activities.

SECTION 13. (1) The Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board shall establish by rule a process for allocating on a quarterly basis available moneys in the Restoration and Protection Subaccount of the Parks and Natural Resources Fund, established under ORS 541.377, to fulfill the biennial allocations made in this 2009 Act. Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, all quarterly allocations shall be set at one-eighth of the biennial allocations.

(2) If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Parks
and Natural Resources Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations established
under subsection (1) of this section, the allocations shall be reduced proportionately by
amounts sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

40 <u>SECTION 14.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 41 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 42 July 1, 2009.

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
