SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to [______] specified state agencies for biennial expenses.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Emergency Board for allocations during biennium.

Increases and decreases certain biennial appropriations made from General Fund to specified state agencies.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by [_____] specified state agencies.

Limits biennial expenditures of [______] specified state agencies from federal funds and lottery bonds.

Increases and decreases limitations on expenditures for certain biennial expenses for specified state agencies.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to state financial administration; appropriating money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$30,000,000 for the purposes for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.
 - SECTION 2. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$32,000,000 for supplemental allocations to state agencies for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009.
 - (2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated by the Emergency Board prior to July 1, 2010, the moneys remaining on that date become available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.
 - SECTION 3. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,500,000 to be allocated to the Department of Justice for ongoing legal costs of the defense of the revenue stream from the Master Settlement Agreement with to-bacco companies.
