House Joint Memorial 11

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges President and Congress to ensure that revenues realized from carbon sequestration projects on federal lands are shared with state and county governments.

JOINT MEMORIAL

2 To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United

3 States of America, in Congress assembled:

We, your memorialists, the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:

6 Whereas Oregon has been a leader in developing and enacting legislation to protect the envi-7 ronment and to foster economic development; and

8 Whereas Oregon is active in efforts to address climate change and is a partner in the Western 9 Climate Initiative; and

10 Whereas the Western Climate Initiative has developed design recommendations for the man-11 agement of greenhouse gas emissions using the market-based concept known as "cap-and-trade"; and 12 Whereas discussions leading to the Western Climate Initiative's design recommendations for the 13 Regional Cap-and-Trade Program have recognized the role that forests play in sequestering carbon

14 dioxide and thereby managing greenhouse gas emissions; and

15 Whereas the Western Climate Initiative has identified a list of projects as a priority for inves-16 tigation and potential participation in the offset program, including projects related to forestry; and

17 Whereas Oregon, as a Western Climate Initiative partner, intends to promote and support fed-18 eral greenhouse gas emission reduction programs that are consistent with the Western Climate Ini-19 tiative's design recommendations; and

20 Whereas Oregon's land base includes vast stretches of federally owned and managed forests; and 21 Whereas these federally owned and managed forests may generate revenue from the carbon 22 sequestration market; and

23 Whereas revenue from these federally owned and managed forests has historically been shared 24 with Oregon's counties to support infrastructure development, schools and public health and safety; 25 now, therefore,

26 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

(1) The President of the United States and the Congress of the United States are respectfully
urged to ensure that revenue realized from carbon sequestration initiatives on federally owned and
managed forests is shared with state and county governments.
