Senate Bill 303

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Authorizes Governor, upon request from humane investigation agency, to commission persons designated by agency as special agents. Requires humane investigation agency to enter into contract with state regarding agency's responsibilities for commissioned special agents.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to humane special agents.

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- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "humane investigation agency" means a private, nonprofit animal care agency that has maintained an animal welfare investigation department for at least five years and has had officers commissioned as special agents by the Governor.
 - (2) Upon the request of a humane investigation agency, the Governor may commission persons designated by the agency who shall have the powers of peace officers and, after being commissioned, may act as peace officers to enforce ORS 167.310 to 167.351, 167.352, 167.355, 167.360 to 167.375, 167.385, 167.388 and 167.390.
 - (3) Special agents commissioned under this section serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The Governor may, for any reason and at any time, refuse to commission a person as a special agent or revoke a previously granted commission.
 - (4) A special agent serves at the expense of the humane investigation agency.
 - (5) A humane investigation agency employing a special agent is civilly responsible for any abuse of the special agent's authority.
 - (6) Before a commission described in subsection (2) of this section becomes effective:
 - (a) The humane investigation agency must enter into a contract with the State of Oregon. The contract may provide:
 - (A) For guidelines and policies to be followed by the agency and commissioned special agents;
 - (B) That the agency will assume liability for the actions of the special agent and will indemnify and hold harmless the State of Oregon and its agents and employees from any claims that arise from the activities of the special agent;
 - (C) That the agency will obtain insurance coverage to cover claims that arise from the actions of a commissioned special agent; and
 - (D) That the agency will provide to the State of Oregon sufficient supporting documentation regarding the insurance coverage.
 - (b) The person who seeks to be commissioned as a special agent must:

(A) Consent to a background investigation; and

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(B) Sign an oath of office, provided by the Governor, that requires the person to support the Constitution and laws of the United States and of the State of Oregon, and to faithfully discharge the duties of the special agent.
