Senate Bill 323

Sponsored by Senator COURTNEY, Representative HUNT (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Allows persons required to submit written reports to Legislative Assembly to do so through posting electronic form of report on Internet and providing online location in executive summary. Requires distribution of physical copy of executive summary to each legislator, offices of presiding officers and Legislative Administrator.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to electronic submission of reports to the Legislative Assembly; amending ORS 192.245; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 192.245 is amended to read:

192.245. (1) Whenever a law of this state requires a written report be submitted to the Legislative Assembly, the requirement shall be met by distribution of an executive summary of no more than two pages sent to every member of the Legislative Assembly and one copy of the report to the office of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one copy to the office of the President of the Senate and five copies to the Legislative [Administration Committee] Administrator. This requirement does not preclude providing a copy of any report to a specific legislative committee if required by law.

(2) A person required to submit a written report to the Legislative Assembly may satisfy the requirements of this section by posting the report on the Internet and providing written notification of the location of the report in the executive summary described in subsection (1) of this section. The online location notification must be prominently identified at the beginning of the executive summary. A person submitting a report to the Legislative Assembly through online submission under this subsection shall distribute one physical copy of the executive summary to each member of the Legislative Assembly, to the offices of the Speaker of the House of Representatives and President of the Senate, and to the Legislative Administrator.

SECTION 2. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect on its passage.
