Senate Bill 327

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Permits Council on Naturopathic Physicians Formulary to determine drugs that naturopathic physicians may not prescribe and to establish formulary of prohibited drugs. Applies to drugs prescribed or administered by naturopathic physicians on or after January 1,

Relating to the practice of naturopathic medicine; creating new provisions; amending ORS 685.010,
685.030, 685.145 and 689.635; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 685.010 is amended to read:

6 685.010. As used in this chapter:

7 (1) "Accredited naturopathic school or college" means any naturopathic school or college of-8 fering a four-year full-time resident program of study in naturopathy leading to a doctoral degree in 9 naturopathic medicine, such program having been approved by the board to meet the standards 10 specifically incorporated into board rules.

11 (2) "Board" means the Board of Naturopathic Examiners.

12 (3) "Drugs" [means] includes:

(a) Substances recognized as drugs in the official United States Pharmacopoeia, official
 National Formulary, official Homeopathic Pharmacopoeia of the United States, other drug
 compendium or any supplement to any of them;

(b) Substances intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment or pre vention of disease in a human or other animal;

(c) Substances, other than food, intended to affect the structure or any function of the
 body of humans or other animals; and

20 (d) Substances intended for use as a component of any substance specified in paragraph (a), (b) or (c) of this subsection. [all medicines and preparations and all substances, except non-21 poisonous plant or animal substances in therapeutic dosages, food and water, substances listed on the 22 formulary established under ORS 685.145 (3), over-the-counter substances, nonprescriptive and non 23Drug Enforcement Agency regulated homeopathic substances and nutritional supplements, used or in-24 tended to be used for the diagnosis, cure, treatment, mitigation or prevention of diseases or abnor-25malities of humans, which are recognized in the latest editions of the official United States 26 27Pharmacopoeia, official Homeopathic Pharmacopoeia, official National Formulary, or any supplement 28 to any of them, or otherwise established as drugs.]

(4) "Minor surgery" means the use of electrical or other methods for the surgical repair and
 care incident thereto of superficial lacerations and abrasions, benign superficial lesions, and the

removal of foreign bodies located in the superficial structures; and the use of antiseptics and local 1 2 anesthetics in connection therewith. (5) "Naturopathic medicine" means the discipline that includes physiotherapy, natural healing 3 processes and minor surgery and has as its objective the maintaining of the body in, or of restoring 4 it to, a state of normal health. $\mathbf{5}$ (6) "Naturopathic physician" means a person who holds a degree of Doctor of Naturopathic 6 Medicine and is licensed under this chapter. 7 [(7) "Nonpoisonous" means a substance taken in accepted therapeutic dosage that by its action on 8 9 organs or tissue does not adversely impair function or destroy human life.] [(8) "Plant or animal substances" means those substances found in nature that comprise the whole 10 or parts of plants or animals and constituents thereof and that have not had changes made in their 11 12 molecular structure as found in nature.] SECTION 2. ORS 685.030 is amended to read: 13 685.030. [Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to:] 14 15 (1) This chapter does not apply to any: (a) Physician [and surgeon, osteopath or] licensed by the Oregon Medical Board to practice 16 17 medicine, osteopathy or podiatry; 18 (b) Chiropractor[,] licensed by the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners; or 19 (c) [to any] Christian Scientist or other person who by religious or spiritual means endeavors to prevent or cure disease or suffering in accord with the tenets of any church. 20(2) [Authorize] This chapter does not authorize licensees to: 21 22(a) Practice optometry or administer chiropractic adjustments[, or]; 23(b) Practice any system or method of treatment not authorized in this chapter[, or to administer or write prescriptions for or dispense drugs,]; or 24 (c) Do major surgery. [except that naturopathic physicians are not prohibited from recommending 25the use of specific and appropriate over-the-counter pharmaceuticals for their patients, or from pre-2627scribing codeine sulfate or codeine phosphate in an appropriate and safe manner.] (3) [Prevent] A licensee under this chapter [from] may perform health maintenance and res-28toration measures consistent with generally recognized and accepted principles of 2930 naturopathic medicine, including but not limited to: 31 (a) Administering, dispensing or writing prescriptions for drugs; (b) Recommending the use of specific and appropriate over-the-counter pharmaceuticals; 32(c) [the administration of the] Administering anesthetics or antiseptics [authorized in ORS 33 34 685.010 (4), from ordering] in connection with minor surgery as defined in ORS 685.010; 35(d) **Ordering** diagnostic tests[, or from the use of]; (e) Using radiopaque substances administered by mouth or rectum necessary for Roentgen di-36 37 agnostic purposes[.]; or 38 (f) Administering substances by penetration of the skin or mucous membrane of the human body for diagnostic, preventive or therapeutic purposes. The Board of Naturopathic 39 Examiners may adopt by rule appropriate procedures for administering substances under 40 this paragraph. 41 [(4) Authorize the administration of any substance by penetration of the skin or mucous membrane 42 of the human body except for diagnostic and preventive purposes or for the therapeutic purpose of ad-43 ministering vitamins and minerals.] 44 SECTION 3. 685.145. (1) The Council on Naturopathic Physicians Formulary is established. [and shall 1 2 consist] The council consists of seven members appointed as follows: (a) One member of the Board of Naturopathic Examiners appointed by the Board of 3 4 Naturopathic Examiners; (b) One physician licensed by the Board of Naturopathic Examiners appointed by the Board of 5 6 Naturopathic Examiners; (c) Two pharmacists licensed by the State Board of Pharmacy appointed by the State Board of 7 Pharmacy; 8 9 (d) One physician licensed by the Oregon Medical Board appointed by the Oregon Medical Board: and 10 (e) Two additional members appointed by the council who hold an advanced degree in a medical 11 12or pharmaceutical science. 13 (2) The chair of the council shall be elected by a majority of the members. (3)(a) [The council established under subsection (1) of this section shall determine the substances 14 15 to be included in the formulary] The council shall establish a formulary of drugs that may not be **administered or** prescribed by a naturopathic physician [acting under ORS 685.010 (3)]. The 16 council shall review the formulary periodically. 17 18 (b) Immediately upon adoption or revision of the formulary, the council shall transmit the [approved] formulary to the Board of Naturopathic Examiners, which must adopt the formulary by 19 rule. [When determined to be appropriate to the scope of practice of naturopathic physicians, the 20Council on Naturopathic Physicians Formulary may also consider synthetically produced substances 2122and their salts having an identical or substantially identical molecular structure to a plant or animal 23substance as found in nature to be plant or animal substances.]

(c) A naturopathic physician may not administer or prescribe drugs that are included in 24 25the formulary adopted by the board.

(4) The term of each member of the council [shall be] is two years. A member shall serve until 2627a successor is appointed. If a vacancy occurs, it shall be filled for the unexpired term by a person with the same qualifications as a retiring member. 28

(5) Any member of the council who fails to attend two consecutive meetings of the council 2930 whether regular or special shall forfeit office unless a member is prevented from attending by seri-31 ous illness of the council member or a member of the council member's family.

(6) Members of the council [shall be] are entitled to compensation and expenses under ORS 32292.495 payable from funds available to the Board of Naturopathic Examiners. 33

34 SECTION 4. ORS 689.635 is amended to read:

35689.635. [The dispensing of plant and animal substances] A drug, as defined in ORS 685.010, 36 prescribed by a naturopathic physician licensed under ORS chapter 685 in accordance with the 37 formulary established by [this section and ORS 685.010, 685.030, 685.145 and dispensed by a licensed 38 pharmacist or the employee thereof may be filled by a pharmacist] ORS 685.145 may be dispensed by a licensed pharmacist or an employee of a licensed pharmacist according to the terms of the 39 prescription. The filling of [such] a prescription [shall] under this section does not constitute evi-40 dence of negligence on the part of the pharmacist or the employee if the prescription is dispensed 41 within the reasonable and prudent practices of pharmacy. 42

SECTION 5. The amendments to ORS 685.030 by section 2 of this 2009 Act become oper-43 ative on January 1, 2010. 44

5 <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 6 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 7 on its passage.
