## Senate Bill 329

Sponsored by Senator BURDICK (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Prohibits operation of motor vehicle while using mobile communication device except under certain circumstances. Authorizes suspension of driving privileges for repeat offenses.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 811.507 is amended to read:
6	811.507. (1) A person [under 18 years of age] commits the offense of operating a motor vehicle
7	while using a mobile communication device if the person, while operating a motor vehicle on a
8	highway, uses a mobile communication device. [and the person holds:]

- [(a) A provisional driver license issued under ORS 807.065;]
- 10 [(b) A special student driver permit issued under ORS 807.230; or]
- 11 [(c) An instruction driver permit issued under ORS 807.280.]
  - (2) For purposes of this section[,]:

- (a) "Hands-free accessory" means an attachment or built-in feature for or an addition to a mobile communication device, whether or not permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used allows a person to maintain both hands on the steering wheel.
- (b) "Mobile communication device" means a text messaging device or a wireless, two-way communication device designed to receive and transmit voice or text communication.
  - (3) This section does not apply:
- (a) To a person who is summoning medical or other emergency help if no other person in the vehicle is capable of summoning help; [or]
- (b) To a person using a mobile communication device for the purpose of farming or agricultural operations[.];
  - (c) To a person operating an ambulance or emergency vehicle; or
  - (d) To a person using a hands-free accessory.
- [(4) Notwithstanding ORS 810.410, a police officer may enforce this provision only as a secondary action when a driver of a motor vehicle has been detained for a suspected traffic violation or some other offense.]
- [(5)] (4) The offense described in this section, operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile communication device, is a Class D traffic violation.
- 30 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 3 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle 31 Code.

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

SECTION 3. (1) The Department of Transportation shall suspend the driving privileges	
of a person who repeatedly commits the offense of operating a motor vehicle while using a	
mobile communication device as described in ORS 811.507.	
(2) The department shall suspend driving privileges under this section for 30 days when	
a person is convicted of a second offense within a three-year period.	

(3) The department shall suspend driving privileges under this section for 90 days when a person is convicted of three or more offenses within a three-year period.

(4) A person is entitled to administrative review under ORS 809.440 of a suspension under this section.
