

# Senate Bill 352

Sponsored by Senator MONROE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes law enforcement agencies to establish sobriety checkpoints.

Takes effect only if Senate Joint Resolution 7 (2009) is approved by people at special election held on same date as next primary election. Takes effect on effective date of constitutional amendment proposed in Senate Joint Resolution 7 (2009).

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to sobriety checkpoints; and prescribing an effective date.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "sobriety checkpoint" means a roadblock estab-**  
5 **lished for the purpose of apprehending persons who are driving while under the influence of**  
6 **intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010.**

7 **(2) A law enforcement agency may establish sobriety checkpoints in its jurisdiction if the**  
8 **checkpoints follow guidelines issued by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration**  
9 **(DOT HS 807 656, November 1990).**

10 **SECTION 2. This 2009 Act does not become effective unless the amendment to the**  
11 **Oregon Constitution proposed by Senate Joint Resolution 7 (2009) is approved by the people**  
12 **at a special election held on the same date as the next primary election. This 2009 Act be-**  
13 **comes effective on the effective date of that amendment.**
