# A-Engrossed Senate Bill 400

Ordered by the House May 26  
Including House Amendments dated May 26 to resolve conflicts

Sponsored by Senator KRUSE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Authorizes State Fish and Wildlife Commission to issue at no charge resident disabled [*war*] veteran shellfish license to person who files with commission written proof that last official certification of record by United States Department of Veterans Affairs or by any branch of Armed Forces of United States shows person to be at least 25 percent disabled.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to shellfish; amending ORS 497.121.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 497.121 is amended to read:

5 497.121. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission is authorized to issue, upon application, to  
6 persons desiring to angle for fish or take shellfish the following licenses and tags and shall charge  
7 therefor the following fees:

8 (a) Resident annual angling license, \$21.

9 (b) Nonresident annual angling license, \$54.75.

10 (c) Nonresident angling license to angle for seven consecutive days, \$39.50.

11 (d) Angling license to angle for one day, \$9.25.

12 (e) Resident annual juvenile angling license for persons 14 through 17 years of age, \$4.

13 (f) Resident annual shellfish license, \$5.

14 (g) Nonresident annual shellfish license, \$15.

15 (h) Nonresident three-day shellfish license, \$7.50.

16 (i) Resident pioneer angling license for persons 65 years of age or older who have resided in the  
17 state for not less than 50 years prior to the date of application, free.

18 (j) Resident annual senior citizen angling license for persons 70 years of age or older who have  
19 resided in the state for not less than five years prior to the date of application, one-half the fee  
20 imposed under paragraph (a) of this subsection for a resident annual angling license.

21 (k) Resident disabled war veteran angling license for a person who files with the commission  
22 written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States Department of Vet-  
23 erans Affairs or by any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States shows the person to be  
24 at least 25 percent disabled, free.

25 **(L) Resident disabled war veteran shellfish license for a person who files with the com-**  
26 **mission written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States De-**

1 **partment of Veterans Affairs or by any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States**  
2 **shows the person to be at least 25 percent disabled, free.**

3 [(L)] (m) Annual tag to angle for salmon, steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut, \$20.

4 [(m)] (n) Annual tag for persons under 18 years of age to angle for salmon, steelhead trout,  
5 sturgeon and halibut, \$5.

6 [(n)] (o) Renewable tag to angle for hatchery salmon and steelhead, \$10.50.

7 (2) Any person who holds a valid permanent angling license for persons who are blind or a  
8 permanent angling license for persons in a wheelchair issued by the commission before January 1,  
9 2000, need not obtain a resident annual angling license under this section.

10 (3) The annual tags to angle for salmon, steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut referred to in  
11 subsection [(1)(L), (m) and (n)] (1)(m), (n) and (o) of this section are in addition to and not in lieu  
12 of the angling licenses required by the wildlife laws. However, an annual tag to angle for salmon,  
13 steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut is not required of a person who holds a valid angling license  
14 referred to in subsection (1)(c) or (d) of this section.

15 **SECTION 2. If Senate Bill 96 becomes law, section 1 of this 2009 Act (amending ORS**  
16 **497.121) is repealed and ORS 497.121, as amended by section 23, chapter 41, Oregon Laws 2009**  
17 **(Enrolled Senate Bill 96), is amended to read:**

18 497.121. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission is authorized to issue, upon application, to  
19 persons desiring to angle for fish or take shellfish the following licenses and tags and shall charge

28 (h) Nonresident three-day shellfish license, \$7.50.

29 (i) Resident pioneer angling license for persons 65 years of age or older who have resided in the  
30 state for not less than 50 years prior to the date of application, free.

31 (j) Resident annual senior citizen angling license for persons 70 years of age or older who have  
32 resided in the state for not less than five years prior to the date of application, one-half the fee  
33 imposed under paragraph (a) of this subsection for a resident annual angling license.

34 (k) Resident disabled veteran angling license for a person who files with the commission written  
35 proof that the last official certification of record by the United States Department of Veterans Af-  
36 fairs or by any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States shows the person to be at least  
37 25 percent disabled, free.

38 **(L) Resident disabled veteran shellfish license for a person who files with the commission**  
39 **written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States Department**  
40 **of Veterans Affairs or by any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States shows the**  
41 **person to be at least 25 percent disabled, free.**

42 [(L)] (m) Annual tag to angle for salmon, steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut, \$20.

43 [(m)] (n) Annual tag for persons under 18 years of age to angle for salmon, steelhead trout,  
44 sturgeon and halibut, \$5.

45 [(n)] (o) Renewable tag to angle for hatchery salmon and steelhead, \$10.50.

1           (2) Any person who holds a valid permanent angling license for persons who are blind or a  
2 permanent angling license for persons in a wheelchair issued by the commission before January 1,  
3 2000, need not obtain a resident annual angling license under this section.

4           (3) The annual tags to angle for salmon, steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut referred to in  
5 subsection [(1)(L), (m) and (n)] **(1)(m), (n) and (o)** of this section are in addition to and not in lieu  
6 of the angling licenses required by the wildlife laws. However, an annual tag to angle for salmon,  
7 steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut is not required of a person who holds a valid angling license  
8 referred to in subsection (1)(c) or (d) of this section.
