SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Repeals statutes that impose liability on plaintiff's attorney for costs awarded to defendant when plaintiff resides out of state or is foreign corporation.

Applies to all actions and related contempt proceedings and ancillary proceedings, whether filed before, on or after the effective date of Act, except actions in which final judgment has been entered before effective date of Act.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 SECTION 1. ORS 20.160 and 20.170 are repealed.

6 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the repeal of ORS 7 20.160 and 20.170 by section 1 of this 2009 Act applies to all actions, whether filed before, on 8 or after the effective date of this 2009 Act, and to any contempt proceeding or other ancillary 9 proceeding arising out of the application of ORS 20.160 and 20.170, whether filed before, on 10 or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.

(2) The repeal of ORS 20.160 and 20.170 by section 1 of this 2009 Act does not apply to an action filed before the effective date of this 2009 Act in which a judgment has been entered that is no longer subject to appeal on the effective date of this 2009 Act, or to a contempt proceeding or other ancillary proceeding arising out of the application of ORS 20.160 and 20.170 in which a judgment has been entered that is no longer subject to appeal on the effective date of this 2009 Act.

17 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 18 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 19 on its passage.
