## Senate Bill 459

Sponsored by Senator METSGER

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## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates Transportation Utility Board. Sunsets January 2, 2012.

- 2 Relating to the Transportation Utility Board.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. (1) There is established within the Public Utility Commission the Transportation Utility Board, consisting of seven members. Five members shall be appointed by the Governor and two members shall be appointed by the chairperson of the Public Utility Commission.
  - (2) The board, in consultation with the Department of Transportation, the Public Utility Commission, counties and cities, shall:
    - (a) Develop a common chart of accounts for revenues and expenditures;
  - (b) Develop, for use by all state, county and city transportation agencies in this state, common descriptions for the condition of the transportation infrastructure;
  - (c) Estimate the total amount of revenue required by all jurisdictions in this state to maintain, preserve and modernize the transportation system;
  - (d) Develop a conceptual framework for funding transportation services and facilities; and
  - (e) Develop and adopt alternative rates for consumers to choose as an option to the motor fuel tax and for use in congestion pricing pilot projects.
  - (3) A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
  - (4) Official action by the board requires the approval of a majority of the members of the board.
- 23 (5) The Governor shall designate one of the members of the board to serve as chair-24 person.
  - (6) If there is a vacancy on the board for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
  - (7) The board shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the board.
    - (8) The board may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the board.
  - (9) No later than December 1, 2010, the Public Utility Commission shall prepare a report of board's activities for submission to the interim House and Senate committees related to

transportation.

- (10) Members of the board who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the board shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of Transportation for purposes of the board.
- (11) The Department of Transportation and the Public Utility Commission are directed to assist the board in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the board consider necessary to perform their duties.

SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on January 2, 2012.
