SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Legislative Administration Committee to repair and restore stairwells on either side of rotunda of State Capitol and [equip stairwells with modern] glass skylights over stairs and to use volunteer labor, to extent possible, to clean and polish [all] brass pieces in original part of State Capitol.

[Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Legislative Administration Committee for projects.]

Directs committee to use moneys available under certificates of participation and grants, donations, contributions and gifts to finance renovation.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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- 2 Relating to improvements to the State Capitol; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1. (1) The Legislative Administration Committee shall:**
 - (a) Repair and restore the stairwells on either side of the rotunda of the State Capitol and repair and restore the glass skylights over the stairs; and
 - (b) Clean and polish brass pieces, including but not limited to the handrails, interior accents, doorknobs, elevator doors and heating grates, in the original part of the State Capitol. This paragraph does not apply to window frames.
 - (2) To the extent possible, the Legislative Administration Committee shall use volunteers to complete the brass cleaning and polishing projects described in subsection (1) of this section.
 - (3) The Legislative Administration Committee shall complete the projects described in this section not later than November 1, 2009.
 - SECTION 2. Subject to the limitation established by section 1 (11), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for the purpose of defraying expenses incurred to complete the projects described in section 1 of this 2009 Act, the Legislative Administration Committee shall use moneys available under certificates of participation authorized by law to finance the Capitol Renovation Project.
 - SECTION 3. In addition to moneys described in section 2 of this 2009 Act, the Legislative Administration Committee may accept grants, donations, contributions or gifts, from any source, for expenditures for any purpose consistent with the purposes of section 1 of this 2009 Act, to be deposited in the State Capitol Operating Account created in ORS 276.003. ORS 276.003 (3) applies to grants, donations, contributions or gifts received under this section.
 - SECTION 4. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

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- peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect on its passage.
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
