

# Senate Bill 466

Sponsored by Senator ATKINSON (at the request of Oregon State Trooper Bill Matson)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Provides that Oregon State Police have jurisdiction over rest areas.

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the Oregon State Police; amending ORS 181.040.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** ORS 181.040 is amended to read:

181.040. (1) The Department of State Police shall enforce all laws now or hereafter enacted relating to highways and *[to]* the operation of vehicles on state or other highways.

(2) Members of the state police have the power to arrest **or issue a citation to** violators of any provision of the laws applicable to highways *[or to]* **and** the movement of vehicles on highways.

**(3) The jurisdiction of the Oregon State Police under ORS 181.030 includes rest areas as defined in ORS 377.710.**

*[(3)]* **(4)** The necessary expenses in carrying out this section shall be paid from the State Highway Fund and from the moneys received under ORS 802.110.

*[(4)]* **(5)** ORS 181.010 to 181.560 and 181.715 to 181.730 do not prevent an officer or employee of the Department of Transportation from arresting any person for any crime committed in the officer's or employee's presence and do not affect other powers of arrest granted by the laws of this state to persons other than peace officers.
