

Senate Bill 483

Sponsored by Senator HASS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires school districts that offer supplemental summer instruction to seek funding to provide supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for reduced charge. Allows school districts to accept contributions for purpose of offering supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for reduced charge.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to summer instruction; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "supplemental summer instruction" means instructional hours:

(a) That are provided during the period when school programs typically are not offered;

(b) That are provided beyond the minimum number of annual instructional hours required by rule of the State Board of Education;

(c) That are not part of the regular school program, as defined in ORS 339.141; and

(d) For which a school district may charge tuition.

(2)(a) A school district that offers supplemental summer instruction shall seek public and private funds for the purpose of offering supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for a reduced charge.

(b) The Department of Education shall make available technical assistance to school districts that seek funding as provided in paragraph (a) of this subsection.

(3) A school district may accept contributions of funds and assistance from the United States Government and its agencies or from any other source, public or private, for the purpose of offering supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for a reduced charge.

SECTION 2. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect July 1, 2009.
