## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Requires school districts that offer supplemental summer instruction to seek funding to provide supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for reduced charge. Allows school districts to accept contributions for purpose of offering supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for reduced charge.]

Requires Department of Education to establish pilot program to encourage school dis-tricts to provide supplemental summer instruction. Directs department to submit report on program to interim legislative committees.

Sunsets January 2, 2012. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

<b>2</b>	Relating to supplemental instruction; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "supplemental summer instruction" means in-
5	structional hours:
6	(a) That are provided during the period when school programs typically are not offered;
7	(b) That are provided beyond the minimum number of annual instructional hours re-
8	quired by rule of the State Board of Education;
9	(c) That are not part of the regular school program, as defined in ORS 339.141; and
10	(d) For which a school district may charge an amount for the instruction.
11	(2)(a) The Department of Education shall establish a pilot program to encourage school
12	districts to provide supplemental summer instruction for the purpose of improving student
13	achievement.
14	(b) The department may encourage school districts to provide supplemental summer in-
15	struction by facilitating communication among school districts regarding the implementation
16	of supplemental summer instruction by school districts participating in the pilot program.
17	(c) The department may establish a process by which a school district may notify the
18	department that the school district will participate in the pilot program.
19	(3) A school district that offers supplemental summer instruction may:
20	(a) Seek public and private funds for the purposes of:
21	(A) Offering supplemental summer instruction at no charge or for a reduced charge; and
22	(B) Paying the administrative expenses of the school district related to providing sup-
23	plemental summer instruction.
24	(b) Accept contributions of funds and assistance from the United States Government and

its agencies or from any other source, public or private, for the purposes described in para-1

 $\mathbf{2}$ graph (a) of this subsection.

3 (c) Enter into contracts with public or private entities to provide supplemental summer instruction in a manner that fulfills the needs of the community. 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ (4) No later than October 1, 2010, the department shall submit a report to the interim legislative committees related to education on the pilot program established under this sec-6 7tion.

8 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed January 2, 2012.

9 SECTION 3. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 10 July 1, 2009.

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
