Senate Bill 520

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE AND VETERANS' AFFAIRS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Human Services to implement Oregon State Hepatitis C Strategic Plan to promote public awareness of hepatitis C. Directs department to establish pilot program for voluntary hepatitis C testing. Authorizes department to award grants or contracts for activities under Act.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to hepatitis C.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Human Services shall implement an Oregon State 5 Hepatitis C Strategic Plan to enhance knowledge and understanding and heighten awareness 6 of hepatitis C. In implementing the plan, the department shall:

7 (a) Conduct health education, public awareness and community outreach activities to 8 promote public awareness and knowledge about risk factors related to hepatitis C, the value 9 of early detection, the availability of screening services and options available for the treat-10 ment of hepatitis C; and

(b) Provide hepatitis C training to staff at public health clinics, mental health facilities,
university clinics, community health centers and urgent care facilities relating to the treatment, detection and transmission of hepatitis C.

(2) The department shall establish by rule a pilot program for voluntary hepatitis C testing and report on the program's results to the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly as provided in ORS 192.245. The department shall keep the results of any test performed through the pilot program confidential and the test results may not be used for insurance purposes, to screen or determine suitability for employment or to discharge a person from employment.

(3) Subject to available funding, including gifts, grants or donations, the department may
award grants to, or enter into contracts or cooperative agreements with, local governments
as defined in ORS 174.116, Indian tribes and nonprofit entities that have special expertise
regarding hepatitis C, to carry out activities under this section.
