

Senate Bill 533

Sponsored by Senator MONNES ANDERSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows local governments to create separate provisions with greater penalties for retailers not complying with shopping cart regulations.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to shopping cart regulations; amending ORS 199.890.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 199.890 is amended to read:

5 199.890. (1) A local government may enact or adopt an ordinance, charter provision, resolution
6 or other regulation to prohibit the unauthorized appropriation of a shopping cart from the business
7 premises of the person that owns the shopping cart and to provide for the salvage or reclamation
8 of an abandoned shopping cart.

9 (2) An ordinance, charter provision, resolution or other regulation enacted or adopted as de-
10 scribed in subsection (1) of this section shall substantially conform with the requirements set forth
11 in ORS 199.891. This subsection does not preclude a local government from enacting or adopting an
12 ordinance, charter provision, resolution or other regulation related to [*the collection or retrieval of*
13 *abandoned shopping carts by a person that is*] **persons that supply shopping carts for public use**
14 **and that are** subject to but not in compliance with ORS 199.891 (1)[(d)].

15 (3) For purposes of this section, "local government" means a city, county, special district or
16 other public commission, authority or entity organized under state statute or city or county charter.
