SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-Limits blennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-ceipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians, State Mortuary and Cemetery Board, Board of Naturopathic Examiners, Oc-cupational Therapy Licensing Board, Board of Radiologic Technology, State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board. Increases for biennium ending June 30, 2009, limitation on expenditures for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-cluding lottery funds and federal funds, for Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians, Board of Naturopathic Evaning Receipt of Badiologic Technology. Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2009] on passage.

Relating to financial administration of specified boards; limiting expenditures; and declaring an $\mathbf{2}$ 3 emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$81,866 5

is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of 6

expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-7

cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Examiners of 8

Licensed Dietitians. 9

10 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$1,312,966 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for 11 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, 12but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Mortuary 13 and Cemetery Board. 14

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$529,869 15is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of 16 17 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Naturopathic 18 Examiners. 19

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$361,756 20 21is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$659,071 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Board of Radiologic Technology.

9 <u>SECTION 6.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$338,982 10 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of 11 expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-12 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Board of Examin-13 ers for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology.

SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$691,999 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians for the payment of expenses of the board from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2009, the limitation on expenditures for the Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians established by section 1, chapter 262, Oregon Laws 2007, as modified by Emergency Board action or the Legislative Assembly in special session, is increased by \$2,729.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Board of Naturopathic Examiners for the payment of expenses of the board from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2009, the limitation on expenditures for the Board of Naturopathic Examiners established by section 3, chapter 262, Oregon Laws 2007, as modified by Emergency Board action or the Legislative Assembly in special session, is increased by \$55,000.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Board of Radiologic Technology for the payment of expenses of the board from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2009, the limitation on expenditures for the Board of Radiologic Technology established by section 6, chapter 262, Oregon Laws 2007, as modified by Emergency Board action or the Legislative Assembly in special session, is increased by \$39,689.

39 <u>SECTION 11.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the State Board of 40 Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology for the payment of expenses of the 41 board from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding 42 lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2009, the limitation on 43 expenditures for the State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology 44 established by section 7, chapter 262, Oregon Laws 2007, as modified by Emergency Board 45 action or the Legislative Assembly in special session, is increased by \$4,785.

<u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures of the Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board for the payment of expenses of the board from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, for the biennium ending June 30, 2009, the limitation on expenditures for the Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board established by section 8, chapter 262, Oregon Laws 2007, as modified by Emergency Board action or the Legislative Assembly in special session, is increased by \$20,120.

8 <u>SECTION 13.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 10 on its passage.
