SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Human Services for certain biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain lottery moneys.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain federal funds.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Increases specified General Fund appropriation made to department for biennium ending June 30, 2009.

Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2009] on passage.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 2930 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 743, Oregon Laws 2007, 31 for Health Services, for the biennium ending June 30, 2009, as modified by Emergency Board action or the Legislative Assembly, is increased by \$6,067,000. 32SECTION 7. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 33 34 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 35 on its passage. 36

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
