Senate Bill 5534

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Maintains lottery revenues available to benefit public purposes during biennium beginning July 1, 2009, in Administrative Services Economic Development Fund. Allocates moneys from fund for biennium beginning July 1, 2009.

Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish process for quarterly allocations of moneys from Administrative Services Economic Development Fund.

Transfers certain interest earnings from Oregon Education Fund to Lottery Bond Fund for payments by Department of Education on education lottery bonds.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> During the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, all lottery revenues available to

5 benefit the public purposes specified in section 4, Article XV of the Oregon Constitution, that

6 are in excess of distributions or allocations required by law shall be maintained in the Ad-

7 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> All moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund as 9 of July 1, 2009, and thereafter are reserved to meet the commitments of this 2009 Act.

10 SECTION 3. The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009,

from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Economic and Community Development Department, for the following purposes:

21 <u>SECTION 4.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Admin-22 istrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Education, for the 23 State School Fund, the amount of \$539,063,144.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Transportation, the amount of \$104,902,804 for the purposes of paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds for rail projects, rail infrastructure assistance

4 <u>SECTION 6.</u> Pursuant to ORS 461.549, there is allocated for the biennium beginning July 5 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Problem 6 Gambling Treatment Fund, for distribution to counties for treatment of gambling addiction, 7 the amount of \$13,109,503.

8 <u>SECTION 7.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Admin-9 istrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Education, for the 10 Lottery Bond Fund for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, 11 if any, on outstanding education lottery bonds, the amount of \$39,685,071.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> There is transferred to the Lottery Bond Fund for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the Oregon Education Fund, 100 percent of the declared earnings on the Education Stability Fund that are transferred to the Oregon Education Fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, to be used by the Department of Education for the purposes of maintaining cash flow and paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, if any, on outstanding education lottery bonds.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Housing and Community Services Department, for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, the amount of \$8,937,854.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for transfer to the State Department of Agriculture, the amount of \$35,972 for the purpose of supporting the administration of county fairs in this state.

26 <u>SECTION 11.</u> Pursuant to ORS 565.447, there is allocated for the biennium beginning July 27 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon De-28 partment of Administrative Services, the amount of \$3,813,569 for the purpose of supporting 29 county fairs in this state. Funds allocated under this section shall be deposited in the County 30 Fair Account established by ORS 565.445.

SECTION 12. There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the amount of \$1,883,170 for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, if any, and bond-related costs on outstanding lottery bonds issued to finance equipment modernization for public broadcasting in Oregon.

36 <u>SECTION 13.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Ad-37 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Higher Education, 38 the amount of \$19,739,466 for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and 39 premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds issued to finance facilities construction and 40 deferred maintenance projects.

41 <u>SECTION 14.</u> There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Ad-42 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the office of the Governor, the 43 amount of \$2,384,958 for expenses of the Economic Revitalization Team.

44 <u>SECTION 15.</u> For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of ORS 461.543 (4), there is 45 allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic SB 5534

Development Fund, to the Sports Lottery Account, the amount of \$13,109,503. 1 2 SECTION 16. There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Adminis-3 trative Services, the amount of \$44,442,726 for distribution to counties for economic 4 development activities as provided by ORS 461.547. 5 SECTION 17. There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, from the Ad-6 ministrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Water Resources Department, the 7 amount of \$224,354 for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and premium, 8 9 if any, on outstanding lottery bonds issued to finance water supply projects. SECTION 18. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall establish by 10 rule a process for allocating available moneys in the Administrative Services Economic De-11 12 velopment Fund on a quarterly basis to fulfill the biennial allocations made in this 2009 Act. SECTION 19. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 39 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 40 July 1, 2009. 41

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
