## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Transportation for rail programs.] Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds.

Limits certain biennial expenditures by department from lottery moneys.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

## Relating to financial administration of the Department of Transportation; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: <u>SECTION 1.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimbursement from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in this section, collected or re-
