## SUMMARY

Limits, for biennium ending June 30, 2009, expenditures from lottery moneys transferred from Education Stability Fund to State School Fund. Appropriates, for biennium beginning July 1, 2009, two-thirds of balance in Oregon Rainy

Appropriates, for biennium beginning July 1, 2009, two-thirds of balance in Oregon Rainy Day Fund to General Fund for general governmental purposes.

Decreases, for biennium ending June 30, 2009, General Fund appropriation made to Department of Education for State School Fund.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

6 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

7 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The Legislative Assembly finds that there has been a decline for two or more 8 consecutive quarters in the last 12 months in seasonally adjusted nonfarm payroll employ-9 ment.

10 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Based on the findings in section 1 of this 2009 Act, and pursuant to sec-11 tion 4 (6), Article XV of the Oregon Constitution, on the effective date of this 2009 Act, the 12 balance of the Education Stability Fund established by ORS 348.696 is transferred from the 13 Education Stability Fund to the State School Fund established by ORS 327.008 for the 14 biennium ending June 30, 2009.

(2) As used in this section, "balance of the Education Stability Fund" means all moneys
in the fund except for moneys in the Oregon Growth Account and the school capital match ing subaccount.

18 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Based on the findings in section 1 of this 2009 Act, and pursuant to ORS 19 293.144, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, two-thirds of the balance in the Oregon 20 Rainy Day Fund on July 1, 2009, is appropriated to the General Fund to be available for

2 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, for the biennium end-

3 ing June 30, 2009, the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of Educa-

4 tion from lottery moneys transferred from the Education Stability Fund to the State School

5 Fund under section 2 of this 2009 Act is \$393,950,531.

6 <u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 7 made to the Department of Education by section 1, chapter 700, Oregon Laws 2007, for the 8 biennium ending June 30, 2009, for the State School Fund, as modified by legislative or 9 Emergency Board action, is decreased by \$393,950,531.

10 <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 11 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect 12 on its passage.
