

Senate Bill 584

Sponsored by Senator FERRIOLI; Senators BOQUIST, GEORGE, GIROD, KRUSE, MORSE, NELSON, TELFER, WHITSETT, WINTERS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires additional persons to file statement of economic interest with Oregon Government Ethics Commission, including staff of commission, board members of public benefit corporations and statewide representatives of labor organizations.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to statements of economic interest; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 244.020,
3 244.050 and 244.060.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 244.050 is amended to read:

6 244.050. (1) On or before April 15 of each year the following persons shall file with the Oregon
7 Government Ethics Commission a verified statement of economic interest as required under this
8 chapter:

9 (a) The Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General, Commissioner of the
10 Bureau of Labor and Industries, Superintendent of Public Instruction, district attorneys and mem-
11 bers of the Legislative Assembly.

12 (b) Any judicial officer, including justices of the peace and municipal judges, except any pro tem
13 judicial officer who does not otherwise serve as a judicial officer.

14 (c) Any candidate for a public office designated in paragraph (a) or (b) of this subsection.

15 (d) The Deputy Attorney General.

16 (e) The Legislative Administrator, the Legislative Counsel, the Legislative Fiscal Officer, the
17 Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives.

18 (f) The Chancellor and Vice Chancellors of the Oregon University System and the president and
19 vice presidents, or their administrative equivalents, in each institution under the jurisdiction of the
20 State Board of Higher Education.

21 (g) The following state officers:

22 (A) Adjutant General.

23 (B) Director of Agriculture.

24 (C) Manager of State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation.

25 (D) Water Resources Director.

26 (E) Director of Department of Environmental Quality.

27 (F) Director of Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

28 (G) State Fish and Wildlife Director.

29 (H) State Forester.

30 (I) State Geologist.

- 22 (v) **Any statewide representative of a labor organization including, but not limited to, the**
- 23 **following organizations:**
- 24 (A) **Service Employees International Union.**
- 25 (B) **American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees.**
- 26 (C) **Association of Oregon Corrections Employees.**
- 27 (D) **Oregon Education Association.**
- 28 (E) **Oregon Nurses Association.**

- 35 (2) By April 15 next after the date an appointment takes effect, every appointed public official
- 36 on a board or commission listed in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the Oregon Govern-
- 37 ment Ethics Commission a statement of economic interest as required under ORS 244.060, 244.070
- 38 and 244.090.
- 39 (3) By April 15 next after the filing deadline for the primary election, each candidate for public
- 40 office described in subsection (1) of this section shall file with the commission a statement of eco-
- 41 nomic interest as required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.
- 42 (4) Within 30 days after the filing deadline for the general election, each candidate for public
- 43 office described in subsection (1) of this section who was not a candidate in the preceding primary
- 44 election, or who was nominated for public office described in subsection (1) of this section at the
- 45 preceding primary election by write-in votes, shall file with the commission a statement of economic

1 interest as required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.

2 (5) Subsections (1) to (4) of this section apply only to persons who are incumbent, elected or
3 appointed public officials as of April 15 and to persons who are candidates for public office on April
4 15. Subsections (1) to (4) of this section also apply to persons who do not become candidates until
5 30 days after the filing deadline for the statewide general election.

6 **(6) By April 15 next after the date that a person becomes a member of a board as de-**
7 **scribed in subsection (1)(u) of this section or becomes a representative of a labor organiza-**
8 **tion as described in subsection (1)(v) of this section, the person shall file a statement of**
9 **economic interest as required under ORS 244.060.**

10 [(6)] (7) If a statement required to be filed under this section has not been received by the
11 commission within five days after the date the statement is due, the commission shall notify the
12 **person**, public official or candidate and give the **person**, public official or candidate not less than
13 15 days to comply with the requirements of this section. If the **person**, public official or candidate
14 fails to comply by the date set by the commission, the commission may impose a civil penalty as
15 provided in ORS 244.350.

16 **SECTION 2.** ORS 244.060 is amended to read:

17 244.060. (1) The statement of economic interest filed under ORS 244.050 shall be on a form pre-
18 scribed by the Oregon Government Ethics Commission.

19 (2) [The] A public official or candidate for public office filing the statement **under ORS 244.050**
20 shall supply the information required by this section and ORS 244.090, as follows:

21 [(1)] (a) The names of all positions as officer of a business and business directorships held by
22 the person or a member of the household of the person during the preceding calendar year, and the
23 principal address and a brief description of each business.

24 [(2)] (b) All names under which the person and members of the household of the person do
25 business and the principal address and a brief description of each business.

26 [(3)] (c) The names, principal addresses and brief descriptions of the five most significant
27 sources of income received at any time during the preceding calendar year by the person and by
28 each member of the household of the person, a description of the type of income and the name of
29 the person receiving the income.

30 [(4)(a)] (d)(A) A list of all real property in which the public official or candidate for public office
31 or a member of the household of the public official or candidate has or has had any personal, ben-
32 efiticial ownership interest during the preceding calendar year, any options to purchase or sell real
33 property, including a land sales contract, and any other rights of any kind in real property located
34 within the geographic boundaries of the governmental agency of which the public official holds, or
35 the candidate if elected would hold, any official position or over which the public official exercises,
36 or the candidate if elected would exercise, any authority.

37 [(b)] (B) This [subsection] **paragraph** does not require the listing of the principal residence of
38 the public official or candidate.

39 [(5)] (e) The name of each member of the household of the person who is 18 years of age or
40 older.

41 [(6)] (f) The name of each relative of the person who is 18 years of age or older and not a
42 member of the household of the person.

43 (3) A person who is not a public official or candidate for public office and who is required
44 to file the statement under ORS 244.050 shall supply the information required by this section
45 as follows:

1 **(a) The names of all positions as officer of a business and business directorships held by**
 2 **the person or a member of the household of the person during the preceding calendar year,**
 3 **and the principal address and a brief description of each business.**

4 **(b) All names under which the person and members of the household of the person do**
 5 **business and the principal address and a brief description of each business.**

6 **(c) The names, principal addresses and brief descriptions of the five most significant**
 7 **sources of income received at any time during the preceding calendar year by the person and**
 8 **by each member of the household of the person, a description of the type of income and the**
 9 **name of the person receiving the income.**

10 **(d) The name of each member of the household of the person who is 18 years of age or**
 11 **older.**

12 **(e) The name of each relative of the person who is 18 years of age or older and not a**
 13 **member of the household of the person.**

14 **SECTION 3.** ORS 244.020 is amended to read:

15 244.020. As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:

16 (1) "Actual conflict of interest" means any action or any decision or recommendation by a per-
 17 son acting in a capacity as a public official, the effect of which would be to the private pecuniary
 18 benefit or detriment of the person or the person's relative or any business with which the person
 19 or a relative of the person is associated unless the pecuniary benefit or detriment arises out of cir-
 20 cumstances described in subsection (11) of this section.

21 (2) "Business" means any corporation, partnership, proprietorship, firm, enterprise, franchise,
 22 association, organization, self-employed individual and any other legal entity operated for economic
 23 gain but excluding any income-producing not-for-profit corporation that is tax exempt under section
 24 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code with which a public official or a relative of the public official
 25 is associated only as a member or board director or in a nonremunerative capacity.

26 (3) "Business with which the person is associated" means:

27 (a) Any private business or closely held corporation of which the person or the person's relative
 28 is a director, officer, owner or employee, or agent or any private business or closely held corpo-
 29 ration in which the person or the person's relative owns or has owned stock, another form of equity
 30 interest, stock options or debt instruments worth \$1,000 or more at any point in the preceding cal-
 31 endar year;

32 (b) Any publicly held corporation in which the person or the person's relative owns or has
 33 owned \$100,000 or more in stock or another form of equity interest, stock options or debt instru-
 34 ments at any point in the preceding calendar year;

35 (c) Any publicly held corporation of which the person or the person's relative is a director or
 36 officer; or

37 (d) For public officials required to file a statement of economic interest under ORS 244.050, any
 38 business listed as a source of income as required under ORS 244.060 [(3)](2)(c).

39 (4) "Development commission" means any entity which has the authority to purchase, develop,
 40 improve or lease land or the authority to operate or direct the use of land. This authority must be
 41 more than ministerial.

42 (5)(a) "Gift" means something of economic value given to a public official or a relative or
 43 member of the household of the public official:

44 (A) Without valuable consideration of equivalent value, including the full or partial forgiveness
 45 of indebtedness, which is not extended to others who are not public officials or the relatives or

1 members of the household of public officials on the same terms and conditions; or

2 (B) For valuable consideration less than that required from others who are not public officials.

3 (b) "Gift" does not mean:

4 (A) Contributions as defined in ORS 260.005.

5 (B) Gifts from relatives or members of the household of the public official.

6 (C) An unsolicited token or award of appreciation in the form of a plaque, trophy, desk item,
7 wall memento or similar item, with a resale value reasonably expected to be less than \$25.

8 (D) Informational material, publications or subscriptions related to the recipient's performance
9 of official duties.

10 (E) Admission provided to or the cost of food or beverage consumed by a public official, or a
11 member of the household or staff of the public official when accompanying the public official, at a
12 reception, meal or meeting held by an organization before whom the public official appears to speak
13 or to answer questions as part of a scheduled program.

14 (F) Reasonable expenses paid by any unit of the federal government, a state or local government,
15 a Native American tribe that is recognized by federal law or formally acknowledged by a state, a
16 membership organization to which a public body as defined in ORS 174.109 pays membership dues
17 or a not-for-profit corporation that is tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
18 Code and that receives less than five percent of its funding from for-profit organizations or entities,
19 for attendance at a convention, fact-finding mission or trip, or other meeting if the public official is
20 scheduled to deliver a speech, make a presentation, participate on a panel or represent state gov-
21 ernment as defined in ORS 174.111, a local government as defined in ORS 174.116 or a special gov-
22 ernment body as defined in ORS 174.117.

23 (G) Contributions made to a legal expense trust fund established under ORS 244.209 for the
24 benefit of the public official.

25 (H) Reasonable food, travel or lodging expenses provided to a public official, a relative of the
26 public official accompanying the public official, a member of the household of the public official ac-
27 companying the public official or a staff member of the public official accompanying the public offi-
28 cial, when the public official is representing state government as defined in ORS 174.111, a local
29 government as defined in ORS 174.116 or a special government body as defined in ORS 174.117:

30 (i) On an officially sanctioned trade-promotion or fact-finding mission; or

31 (ii) In officially designated negotiations, or economic development activities, where receipt of the
32 expenses is approved in advance.

33 (I) Food or beverage consumed by a public official acting in an official capacity:

34 (i) In association with the review, approval, execution of documents or closing of a borrowing,
35 investment or other financial transaction, including any business agreement between state govern-
36 ment as defined in ORS 174.111, a local government as defined in ORS 174.116 or a special govern-
37 ment body as defined in ORS 174.117 and a private entity or public body as defined in ORS 174.109;

38 (ii) While engaged in due diligence research or presentations by the office of the State Treasurer
39 related to an existing or proposed investment or borrowing; or

40 (iii) While engaged in a meeting of an advisory, governance or policy-making body of a corpo-
41 ration, partnership or other entity in which the office of the State Treasurer has invested moneys.

42 (J) Waiver or discount of registration expenses or materials provided to a public official at a
43 continuing education event that the public official may attend to satisfy a professional licensing
44 requirement.

45 (K) Expenses provided by one public official to another public official for travel inside this state

1 to or from an event that bears a relationship to the receiving public official's office and at which
2 the official participates in an official capacity.

3 (L) Food or beverage consumed by a public official at a reception where the food or beverage
4 is provided as an incidental part of the reception and no cost is placed on the food or beverage.

5 (M) Entertainment provided to a public official or a relative or member of the household of the
6 public official that is incidental to the main purpose of another event.

7 (N) Entertainment provided to a public official or a relative or member of the household of the
8 public official where the public official is acting in an official capacity while representing state
9 government as defined in ORS 174.111, a local government as defined in ORS 174.116 or a special
10 government body as defined in ORS 174.117 for a ceremonial purpose.

11 (6) "Honorarium" means a payment or something of economic value given to a public official in
12 exchange for services upon which custom or propriety prevents the setting of a price. Services in-
13 clude, but are not limited to, speeches or other services rendered in connection with an event.

14 (7) "Income" means income of any nature derived from any source, including, but not limited to,
15 any salary, wage, advance, payment, dividend, interest, rent, honorarium, return of capital,
16 forgiveness of indebtedness, or anything of economic value.

17 (8) "Legislative or administrative interest" means an economic interest, distinct from that of the
18 general public, in one or more bills, resolutions, regulations, proposals or other matters subject to
19 the action or vote of a person acting in the capacity of a public official.

20 (9) "Member of the household" means any person who resides with the public official.

21 (10) "Planning commission" means a county planning commission created under ORS chapter 215
22 or a city planning commission created under ORS chapter 227.

23 (11) "Potential conflict of interest" means any action or any decision or recommendation by a
24 person acting in a capacity as a public official, the effect of which could be to the private pecuniary
25 benefit or detriment of the person or the person's relative, or a business with which the person or
26 the person's relative is associated, unless the pecuniary benefit or detriment arises out of the fol-
27 lowing:

28 (a) An interest or membership in a particular business, industry, occupation or other class re-
29 quired by law as a prerequisite to the holding by the person of the office or position.

30 (b) Any action in the person's official capacity which would affect to the same degree a class
31 consisting of all inhabitants of the state, or a smaller class consisting of an industry, occupation or
32 other group including one of which or in which the person, or the person's relative or business with
33 which the person or the person's relative is associated, is a member or is engaged.

34 (c) Membership in or membership on the board of directors of a nonprofit corporation that is
35 tax-exempt under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code.

36 (12) "Public office" has the meaning given that term in ORS 260.005.

37 (13) "Public official" means any person who, when an alleged violation of this chapter occurs,
38 is serving the State of Oregon or any of its political subdivisions or any other public body as defined
39 in ORS 174.109 as an elected official, appointed official, employee, agent or otherwise, irrespective
40 of whether the person is compensated for the services.

41 (14) "Relative" means:

42 (a) The spouse of the public official;

43 (b) The domestic partner of the public official;

44 (c) Any children of the public official or of the public official's spouse;

45 (d) Siblings, spouses of siblings or parents of the public official or of the public official's spouse;

1 (e) Any individual for whom the public official has a legal support obligation; or

2 (f) Any individual for whom the public official provides benefits arising from the public official's
3 public employment or from whom the public official receives benefits arising from that individual's
4 employment.

5 (15) "Statement of economic interest" means a statement as described by ORS 244.060, 244.070
6 or 244.100.

7 (16) "Zoning commission" means an entity to which is delegated at least some of the discre-
8 tionary authority of a planning commission or governing body relating to zoning and land use mat-
9 ters.

10 **SECTION 4. The amendments to ORS 244.050 and 244.060 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2009**
11 **Act apply to statements of economic interest required to be filed with the Oregon Govern-**
12 **ment Ethics Commission for reporting periods beginning on or after January 1, 2010.**
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
