

Senate Bill 626

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Increases fee for screening interviews of persons convicted of driving while under influence of intoxicants.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants; amending ORS 813.021.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 813.021 is amended to read:

5 813.021. (1) When a court, in accordance with ORS 813.020, requires a person to complete a
6 screening interview and a treatment program, the court shall require the person to do all of the
7 following:

8 (a) Complete a screening interview for the purpose of determining appropriate placement of the
9 person in a program for treatment for alcoholism, drug dependency or dependency on inhalants.

10 (b) Pay directly to the agency or organization conducting the screening interview a fee of
11 [*\$150*] **\$250**.

12 (c) Complete the treatment program to which the person is referred.

13 (d) Pay for the treatment program to which the person is referred.

14 (2) The screening interview required by this section shall be conducted by an agency or organ-
15 ization designated by the court. The designated agency or organization must meet the standards set
16 by the Director of Human Services to conduct the screening interviews. Wherever possible a court
17 shall designate agencies or organizations to perform the screening interview that are separate from
18 those that may be designated to carry out a treatment program.

19 (3) An agency or organization doing a screening interview under this section may not refer a
20 person to a treatment program that has not been approved by the Director of Human Services.

21 (4) The agency or organization conducting a screening interview under this section shall moni-
22 tor the progress of the person referred to the agency or organization. The agency or organization
23 shall make a report to the referring court stating the person's successful completion or failure to
24 complete all or any part of the screening interview or of the treatment program to which the person
25 was referred by the agency or organization. The report shall be in a form determined by agreement
26 between the court and the agency or organization.
