SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Clarifies distribution and expenditure of certain amounts of local revenues received by component school districts of education service districts.

Allows certain elementary schools that merge to qualify as remote small elementary school until July 1, 2012.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to school finance; creating new provisions; amending ORS 327.077 and 334.177; and declar-

3 ing an emergency.

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 334.177 is amended to read:

6 334.177. (1) As used in this section, "local revenues of an education service district" has

the meaning given that term in ORS 327.019 but does not include any local revenues distributed to component school districts under ORS 327.019 (8).

9 [(1)] (2) An education service district board shall expend at least 90 percent of all amounts re-10 ceived from the State School Fund and at least 90 percent of all amounts considered to be local 11 revenues of an education service district[, as defined in ORS 327.019,] on services or programs that 12 have been approved by the component school districts of the education service district through the 13 resolution process described in ORS 334.175.

[(2)] (3) An education service district board shall expend 100 percent of all amounts received from the School Improvement Fund on services or programs that have been approved by the component school districts of the education service district through the resolution process described in ORS 334.175.

18 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 3 of this 2009 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 327.006 to
 19 327.133.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding ORS 327.013 (10)(j), for the 2003-2004, 2004-2005, 2005-2006, 2006-2007, 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 fiscal years, local revenues of a school district under ORS 327.013 (10) do not include amounts distributed to the school district in the prior fiscal year under ORS 327.019 (8) or section 4 (3), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2001.

24 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Any distribution or expenditure of any local revenues described in ORS 25 327.019 (8) by an education service district that was made before the effective date of this

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school under this section only if the location of the school has not changed since January 1, 1995, 1 and if the school qualified as a nonchartered public remote small school on July 18, 1995. 2

(d) A public charter school as defined in ORS 338.005 may qualify as a small high school under 3 this section only if the location of the school has not changed since January 1, 1995, and if the 4 school qualified as a nonchartered public remote small school on July 18, 1995. 5

(e) The Superintendent of Public Instruction may waive the requirements of paragraph (a), (b), 6 (c) or (d) of this subsection if the superintendent determines that exceptional circumstances exist. 7

(f) An alternative education program as defined in ORS 336.615 may not qualify as a small high 8 9 school under this section.

10 [(8)] (9) The opening of a public charter school shall not disqualify a school as a remote small elementary school under subsection [(3)] (4) of this section or change the distance adjustment for a 11 12 school under subsection [(6)] (7) of this section.

(10)(a) Notwithstanding subsections (2), (4), (5) and (8)(a) and (c) of this section, if two 13 elementary schools merge and prior to the merger at least one of the elementary schools 14 15 qualified as a remote small elementary school under this section, the Department of Educa-16 tion shall continue to add an additional amount pursuant to subsection (5) of this section to the ADMw of the school district in which the new merged elementary school is located. The 17 18 amount added under this subsection shall equal the additional amount that each of the former remote small elementary schools would have received under this section for the remote 19 20small elementary school based on the ADMa of each of the elementary schools prior to the 21merger.

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(b) This subsection applies only to elementary schools located in counties with a popu-23lation of less than 2,000 and a total area of not more than 1,000 square miles.

[(9)(a)] (11)(a) Notwithstanding subsections [(2), (5) and (7)(b) and (d)] (3), (6) and (8)(b) and (d) 24of this section, if two high schools merge and prior to the merger at least one of the high schools 25qualified as a small high school under this section, the Department of Education shall continue to 2627add an additional amount pursuant to subsection [(5)] (6) of this section to the ADMw of the school district in which the new merged high school is located that is equal to the higher of: 28

(A) The additional amount the school district of each of the former small high schools would 2930 have received under this section for the small high school based on the ADMa of each of the high 31 schools prior to the merger; or

32(B) In the case of a high school that remains qualified as a small high school under subsection [(2)] (3) of this section after a merger, the ADMa of the merged small high school. 33

34 (b) The department shall add the additional amount under this subsection only for the first four 35 fiscal years after the merger of the two high schools is final. [(a) The "adjusted average daily membership" or "ADMa" for an elementary school shall be the 39 average daily membership for the school, but no less than 25.] 40

[(b) The "adjusted average daily membership" or "ADMa" for a high school shall be the average 41 daily membership for the school, but no less than 60.] 42

SECTION 6. The amendments to ORS 327.077 by section 5 of this 2009 Act apply to State 43 School Fund distributions occurring in fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2009. 44

The amount added under this subsection shall equal the additional 14 15 amount that each of the former remote small elementary schools would have received under this section for the remote small elementary school based on the ADMa of each of the elementary schools prior to 16 17 the merger.]

[(b) This subsection applies only to elementary schools located in counties with a population of less
 than 2,000 and a total area of not more than 1,000 square miles.]

[(11)(a)] (10)(a) Notwithstanding subsections (3), (6) and (8)(b) and (d) of this section, if two high schools merge and prior to the merger at least one of the high schools qualified as a small high school under this section, the Department of Education shall continue to add an additional amount pursuant to subsection (6) of this section to the ADMw of the school district in which the new merged high school is located that is equal to the higher of:

(A) The additional amount the school district of each of the former small high schools would
have received under this section for the small high school based on the ADMa of each of the high
schools prior to the merger; or

(B) In the case of a high school that remains qualified as a small high school under subsection(3) of this section after a merger, the ADMa of the merged small high school.

(b) The department shall add the additional amount under this subsection only for the first four
fiscal years after the merger of the two high schools is final. If the merger of the two high schools
becomes final on or before September 1, for purposes of this paragraph the merger shall be considered final in the prior fiscal year.

34 <u>SECTION 8.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 327.077 by section 7 of this 2009 Act become 35 operative on July 1, 2012.

(2) The amendments to ORS 327.077 by section 7 of this 2009 Act apply to State School
 Fund distributions occurring in fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2012.

38 <u>SECTION 9.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 39 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect
 40 July 1, 2009.

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
