## Senate Bill 67

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs designated state institution of higher education to release certain student data upon request for research purposes and other purposes allowed by law. Requires Department of Education to transfer certain data to institution.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to student data.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Chancellor of the Oregon University System may designate a state institution of higher education listed in ORS 352.002 to be responsible for storing and managing data transferred by the Department of Education to the institution under subsection (3) of this section.
- (2) Upon request for research purposes and other purposes allowed by state or federal law, the state institution of higher education designated under subsection (1) of this section shall release student data transferred to the institution by the Department of Education under subsection (3) of this section.
- (3) By December 1 of each year after a state institution of higher education is designated under subsection (1) of this section, the Department of Education shall transfer to the institution student data that:
  - (a) Is related to public school students who attend kindergarten through grade 12;
  - (b) Was collected by the department for the previous school year; and
- (c) Does not include personally identifiable information or is considered directory information under the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (20 U.S.C. 1232g).
