## Senate Bill 69

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## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires pilot education service district to contract with public or private entity to conduct election of director.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to pilot education service district; creating new provisions; amending section 11, chapter 828, Oregon Laws 2005; and declaring an emergency.

## Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- **SECTION 1.** Section 11, chapter 828, Oregon Laws 2005, as amended by section 3, chapter 589, Oregon Laws 2007, is amended to read:
- **Sec. 11.** (1) Notwithstanding ORS chapter 334, the board of directors of a pilot education service district shall consist of nine members as follows:
- (a) Five directors [shall] **who** represent zones established under ORS 334.032 and [shall be] **who** are elected by the boards of the component school districts; and
- (b) Four directors [shall be] who are appointed by the directors described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, including:
  - (A) One at-large director [and a director representing each of the following:];
- [(A)] **(B) One director representing** public post-secondary institutions located within the pilot education service district;
  - [(B)] (C) One director representing social service providers; and
  - [(C)] (D) One director representing the business community.
- (2) [Prior to April 1, 2006, the board of directors of] A pilot education service district shall [divide the pilot education service district into] consist of five zones that are as nearly equal in census population as may be practicable, measured along common school district boundary lines.
- (3) The board of directors of a pilot education service district may readjust the boundaries of the zones once each year and shall readjust the boundaries of the zones immediately upon any change of the boundaries of the pilot education service district or a component school district.
- (4)(a) Prior to the end of the term of office of any elected director of the Northwest Regional Education Service District, the boards of the component school districts within the zone the director represented shall elect a successor whose term begins on July 1 next following. Each component school district board shall have one vote. A director is eligible for reelection.
- (b) Prior to the end of the term of office of any appointed director of the Northwest Regional Education Service District, the directors described in subsection (1)(a) of this section shall appoint a successor whose term begins on July 1 next following. A director who was appointed under sub-

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section (1)(b) of this section is eligible for reappointment.

- (5) Any vacancy on the board of directors of a pilot education service district that occurs before the end of the term of office of a director of a pilot education service district shall be filled following the process described in this section.
- (6) A pilot education service district shall contract with a public or private entity to conduct any election of directors required by this section. The district may not contract with a component school district to conduct the election.

SECTION 2. The amendments to section 11, chapter 828, Oregon Laws 2005, by section 1 of this 2009 Act first apply to the election of a director whose term expires or whose office is declared vacant on or after the effective date of this 2009 Act.

SECTION 3. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect July 1, 2009.
