## Senate Bill 700

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates Task Force on Veterans' Reintegration. Directs task force to develop and design veterans' reintegration programs. Sunsets task force on date of convening of next regular biennial legislative session.

Sunsets task force on date of convening of next regular biennial legislative session. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

<b>2</b>	Relating to reintegration of veterans; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) There is created the Task Force on Veterans' Reintegration, consisting
5	of nine members appointed as follows:
6	(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the
7	Senate;
8	(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among
9	members of the House of Representatives;
10	(c) The Director of Veterans' Affairs shall appoint one representative from the Depart-
11	ment of Veterans' Affairs;
12	(d) The Director of Human Services shall appoint one representative from the Depart-
13	ment of Human Services;
14	(e) The Adjutant General shall appoint one representative from the reintegration team
15	within the Oregon Military Department;
16	(f) The Director of the Employment Department shall appoint one representative from
17	the Employment Department;
18	(g) The Director of the Housing and Community Services Department shall appoint one
19	representative from the Housing and Community Services Department;
20	(h) The Chancellor of the Oregon University System shall appoint one representative
21	from the Oregon University System; and
22	(i) The Commissioner for Community College Services shall appoint one representative
23	from a community college.
24	(2) The task force shall develop and design continuing regional veterans' reintegration
25	programs.
26	(3) The task force, in developing and designing veterans' reintegration programs, shall
27	consult with federal, state, county and local entities, including but not limited to:
28	(a) The Oregon congressional delegation;
29	(b) The Veterans Benefits Administration;
30	(c) The Veterans Health Administration;

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(d) The Association of Oregon Counties; 1 2 (e) The United States Department of Labor; (f) An association of county veterans' service officers; 3 (g) The League of Oregon Cities; and 4 (h) Regional councils of government. 5 (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 6 of business. 7 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 8 9 of the task force. (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 10 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-11 12ment to become immediately effective. (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 13 or of a majority of the members of the task force. 14 15 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. (10) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor no 16 later than October 1, 2010. 17 (11) Each of the agencies represented on the task force shall provide staff support to the 18 task force. 19 (12) Notwithstanding ORS 171.072, members of the task force who are members of the 20Legislative Assembly are not entitled to mileage expenses or a per diem and serve as volun-2122teers on the task force. Other members of the task force are not entitled to compensation 23or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force. (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 94 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 25to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 2627consider necessary to perform their duties. SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next 28regular biennial legislative session. 2930 SECTION 3. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 31 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect

32 33 on its passage.
