

# Senate Bill 711

Sponsored by Senator BOQUIST; Senators FERRIOLI, GEORGE, KRUSE, STARR, TELFER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Encourages contracting agencies to use emergency procurement methods for capital construction projects in biennium beginning July 1, 2007. Sunsets January 2, 2012.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to emergency procurement for financed capital construction projects; and declaring an  
3 emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1. (1) The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:**

6 (a) **Job creation and retention is needed at this time to provide stimulus to the Oregon**  
7 **economy; and**

8 (b) **The economic circumstances justify a determination by the head of a contracting**  
9 **agency, or a person designated under ORS 279A.075, that an emergency exists and that the**  
10 **use of emergency procurement authority granted by ORS 279B.080 is warranted.**

11 (2) **For authorized capital construction projects, all or part of which are financed through**  
12 **general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, certificates of participation and other financing**  
13 **agreements to be issued and sold in the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, the Legislative As-**  
14 **sembly encourages the use of emergency procurement procedures and directs that, in the**  
15 **use of emergency procurement procedures, a contracting agency shall use:**

16 (a) **Methods that ensure fairness;**

17 (b) **Only legal, responsible contractors;**

18 (c) **When practicable, companies located in Oregon and products manufactured in**  
19 **Oregon; and**

20 (d) **When practicable, minority, women and emerging small business enterprises certified**  
21 **under ORS 200.055 as service and product providers.**

22 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on January 2, 2012.**

23 **SECTION 3. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
24 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect**  
25 **on its passage.**
