## Senate Bill 764

Sponsored by Senator HASS, Representative READ

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires student to complete application for post-secondary education institution in order to receive high school diploma.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to high school diploma requirements; amending ORS 329.451 and section 3, chapter 827, 3 Oregon Laws 2005. Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 SECTION 1. ORS 329.451 is amended to read: 5 6 329.451. (1) At or before grade 12, a school district or public charter school shall award a high 7 school diploma to a student who completes the requirements established by [the State Board of Education, the school district or public charter school and] subsection (2) of this section. 8 9 (2) In order to receive a high school diploma from a school district or public charter school, a student must: 10 (a) Satisfy the requirements established by the State Board of Education and the require-11 ments established by the school district or public charter school. [and,] 12 13(b) Complete at least one admission form or application for admission to a career school, a community college or an institution of higher education for a program of post-secondary 14 education or training. A form or an application completed under this paragraph need not be 15submitted to the school, college or institution for consideration. 16 17 (c) While in grades 9 through 12, [must] complete: [(a)] (A) At least 24 credits, as defined by rule of the board; 18 19 [(b)] (B) Three credits of mathematics; and [(c)] (C) Four credits of English. 20 21(3) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, a school district or public charter school may 22award a diploma to a student who does not satisfy the requirements of subsection [(2)(b) or (c)](2)(c)(B) or (C) of this section if the student: 2324 (a) Has met or exceeded the academic content standards for mathematics or English established 25by the board, as demonstrated on Oregon state assessments; or 26 (b) Displays proficiency in mathematics or English at a level established by the board. 27(4) A student may satisfy the requirements of subsection (2) of this section in less than four 28 years. If a student satisfies the requirements of subsection (2) of this section and a school district or public charter school has the consent of the student's parent or guardian, the school district or 29public charter school shall award a diploma to the student upon request from the student. 30 31 (5) If a school district or public charter school has the consent of a student's parent or guardian,

the school district or public charter school may advance the student to the next grade level if the 1 student has satisfied the requirements for the student's current grade level. 2 (6) The requirement for obtaining the consent of a student's parent or guardian under sub-3 sections (4) and (5) of this section does not apply to a student who is: 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (a) Emancipated pursuant to ORS 419B.550 to 419B.558; or (b) 18 years of age or older. 6 (7)(a) Notwithstanding [subsections (1) and (2)] subsection (1) of this section, a school district 7 or public charter school shall award a modified diploma to a student who does not satisfy the re-8 9 quirements of [subsections (1) and (2)] subsection (2) of this section if the student meets requirements established by the State Board of Education by rule. 10 (b) The modified diploma shall be made available only to those students who have demonstrated 11 12 the inability to meet the full set of academic content standards even with reasonable modifications 13 and accommodations. To be eligible for a modified diploma, a student must have: (A) A documented history of an inability to maintain grade level achievement due to significant 14 15 learning and instructional barriers; or 16 (B) A documented history of a medical condition that creates a barrier to achievement. (8) A school district or public charter school shall award an alternative certificate to a student 17 who does not satisfy the requirements for a diploma if the student meets requirements established 18 by the board of the school district or public charter school. 19 (9) A student who receives a modified diploma or alternative certificate shall have the option 20of participating in a high school graduation ceremony with the class of the student. 2122(10) The State Board of Education shall submit for review by the legislative committees on ed-23ucation or the interim legislative committees on education, as appropriate, any proposed rules to implement requirements for a diploma, a modified diploma or an alternative certificate prior to the 24 adoption of those rules by the board. 25SECTION 2. Section 3, chapter 827, Oregon Laws 2005, as amended by section 2, chapter 407, 2627Oregon Laws 2007, and section 15, chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2007, is amended to read: Sec. 3. (1) The requirements of ORS 329.451 (2)(a) and (c) and (3) apply to students who receive 28a high school diploma from a school district on or after July 1, 2009. 2930 (2) The requirements of ORS 329.451 (2)(b) apply to students who receive a high school 31 diploma from a school district on or after July 1, 2010. [(2)] (3) ORS 329.451 (4) applies to students who satisfy the requirements for a high school di-32ploma on or after [the effective date of chapter 407, Oregon Laws 2007] July 1, 2007. 33 34 [(3)] (4) ORS 329.451 (5) first applies to the 2007-2008 school year. [(4)] (5) The requirements of ORS 329.451 (2)(a) and (c) and (3) apply to students who receive 35a high school diploma from a public charter school: 36 37 (a) On or after July 1, 2009, if the charter of the public charter school specified that ORS

38 329.451 applied to the school prior to [the effective date of this 2007 Act] July 1, 2007; or

39 (b) On or after July 1, 2011.

40 (6) The requirements of ORS 329.451 (2)(b) apply to students who receive a high school
41 diploma from a public charter school:

42 (a) On or after July 1, 2010, if the charter of the public charter school specified that ORS
43 329.451 applied to the school prior to July 1, 2007; or

44 (b) On or after July 1, 2011.

45 [(5)] (7) School districts and public charter schools shall make modified diplomas and alternative

certificates as required by ORS 329.451 (7) and (8) first available to students during the 2008-2009
 school year.

3 [(6)] (8) Notwithstanding subsections [(4) and] (5) and (7) of this section, ORS 329.451 as 4 amended by section 12, chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2007, [of this 2007 Act] applies to public charter 5 schools that enter into a charter or renew a charter on or after [the effective date of this 2007 Act] 6 July 1, 2007.
