A-Engrossed Senate Bill 858

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Department of Human Services to develop and implement community outreach campaign and media campaign on underage alcohol use. [Appropriates moneys for carrying out campaigns.] [Sunsets January 2, 2016.]

Directs State Board of Education, Department of Education and Department of Human Services to develop methods for ensuring that district school boards and schools comply with laws and rules relating to underage alcohol use prevention and for working with schools and local communities to implement strategies for preventing underage alcohol use.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to underage alcohol use.

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Whereas nearly 29 percent of Oregon's eighth-graders and more than 46 percent of Oregon's eleventh-graders reported regular alcohol use last year, and nearly 38,000 youths in Oregon may have a serious alcohol problem; and

Whereas young people in Oregon who begin drinking alcoholic beverages before 15 years of age are four times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who begin drinking at 21 years of age or later; and

Whereas the younger a person is when the person starts drinking alcoholic beverages, the more likely the person is to become alcoholic; and

Whereas alcohol is the most frequently used drug by high school and middle school students in Oregon; and

Whereas the brain goes through dynamic changes in adolescence and alcohol can seriously damage long-term and short-term growth processes; and

Whereas alcohol use is the leading cause of death among youths and contributes substantially to motor vehicle crashes, traumatic injuries, suicides and family and school problems among adolescents; and

Whereas alcohol is a factor in two-thirds of all sexual assaults and date rapes of teens and college students and contributes to unprotected sex among youths, increasing their risk of contracting human immunodeficiency virus or other sexually transmitted diseases; now, therefore,

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Subject to the availability of funds dedicated to the purpose, the Department of Human Services shall develop and implement a community outreach campaign to mobilize communities to confront the problem of underage alcohol use.

SECTION 2. Subject to the availability of funds dedicated to the purpose, the Department

of Human Services shall work with local nonprofit organizations to develop and implemen
a statewide media campaign on underage alcohol use that disseminates information through
radio, television, print media and the Internet.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> The State Board of Education, the Department of Education and the Department of Human Services shall work collaboratively to develop methods for:

- (1) Ensuring that district school boards and schools in this state comply with ORS 336.222 and the rules adopted by the State Board of Education relating to underage alcohol use prevention; and
- (2) Working with schools and their local communities to implement effective strategies for preventing underage alcohol use.

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
