Senate Bill 885

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Sets special election on May 19, 2009, for Senate Joint Resolution 29 (2009). Declares emergency, effective on passage.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Except as otherwise provided in this 2009 Act, ORS chapters 250, 251 and 254
5	apply to the special election held on Senate Joint Resolution 29 (2009).
6	SECTION 2. A special election shall be held throughout this state on May 19, 2009. The
7	measure referred to in section 1 of this 2009 Act and that is otherwise referred to the people
8	by the Legislative Assembly shall be submitted to the electors for their approval or rejection
9	at the special election.
10	SECTION 3. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 250.035, 250.067, 250.075 (2) and 250.085 (3), the ballot

SECTION 5. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 251.205, 251.215, 251.225, 251.230 and 251.235, the 7 explanatory statement to be printed in the voters' pamphlet for Senate Joint Resolution 29 8 9 (2009) shall be:

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15 (2) ORS 251.235 does not apply to the explanatory statement contained in this section. The explanatory statement contained in this section shall be printed in the voters' pamphlet. 16 SECTION 6. (1) Arguments relating to the measure referred to in section 1 of this 2009 17 Act may be filed with the Secretary of State under ORS 251.245 and 251.255, except that an 18 argument must be filed not later than the date set by the Secretary of State by rule. 19

(2) Notwithstanding ORS 192.410 to 192.505 relating to public records, an argument filed 20under this section is exempt from public inspection until the fourth business day after the 2122deadline for filing the argument.

23SECTION 7. (1) The Secretary of State shall cause to be printed in the voters' pamphlet the number, ballot title and text of the measure referred to in section 1 of this 2009 Act and 24 the financial estimate, explanatory statement and arguments relating to the measure. The 25Secretary of State shall also cause to be printed in the voters' pamphlet any other material 2627required by law. Notwithstanding ORS 251.026, the Secretary of State shall include in the voters' pamphlet the information or statements described in ORS 251.026 that the Secretary 28of State considers applicable to the election on the measure referred to in section 1 of this 2930 2009 Act. Notwithstanding ORS 251.285 and subject to ORS 251.008, the measure referred to 31 in section 1 of this 2009 Act shall be the only measure included in the voters' pamphlet pre-32pared under this section.

(2) Not later than the 10th day before the election, the Secretary of State shall cause the 33 34 voters' pamphlet to be mailed to each post-office mailing address in Oregon and may use any 35additional means of distribution necessary to make the pamphlet available to electors.

(3) In preparing the voters' pamphlet under this section, the Secretary of State is not 36 37 required to comply with ORS chapter 279B relating to competitive bidding.

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(4) For purposes of sections 1 to 9 of this 2009 Act, the election referred to in ORS 251.295 is the special election held on the date specified in section 2 of this 2009 Act. 39

SECTION 8. (1) Notwithstanding the deadline in ORS 254.085, the Secretary of State shall 40 prepare and deliver to each county clerk by the most expeditious means practicable a certi-41 fied statement of the measure referred to in section 1 of this 2009 Act. The Secretary of 42 State shall include with the statement the number, financial estimate and full ballot title of 43 the measure, and any other information required by law. The Secretary of State shall keep 44 a copy of the statement. 45

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(2) The county clerks shall print on the ballot the number, financial estimate and full
ballot title of the measure, along with any other material required by law. In lieu of printing
the financial estimate, the summary portion of the ballot title or other material required by
law on the ballot, a county clerk may include with the ballot the complete text of the ballot
title, the financial estimate and any other material required by law.
SECTION 9. The Secretary of State may adopt rules governing the procedures for con-

ducting the election on the measure referred to in section 1 of this 2009 Act as may be necessary to implement sections 1 to 9 of this 2009 Act.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect
 on its passage.

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
