Senate Bill 906

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION AND GENERAL GOVERNMENT (at the request of Stacy Michaelson)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Creates Task Force on Increasing the Numbers of Oregon Students in Post-Secondary Education. Sunsets task force on date of convening of next regular biennial legislative session. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to participation of Oregon students in post-secondary education; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Task Force on Increasing the Numbers of Oregon 6 Students in Post-Secondary Education, consisting of 15 members appointed as follows:
- 7 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among members of the 8 Senate.
 - (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one member from among members of the House of Representatives.
 - (c) The Governor shall appoint:
 - (A) One member representing community colleges;
- 13 (B) One member representing accredited vocational or professional certification schools;
- 14 (C) Two members representing secondary schools;
- 15 (D) One member representing primary schools;
- 16 **(E)** One member who is a current university student and who is a member of an under-17 represented demographic group;
 - (F) One member who is a current high school student and who is a member of an under-represented demographic group; and
 - (G) One member who is the parent of a child in an under-represented demographic group.
 - (d) The Chancellor of the Oregon University System shall appoint:
 - (A) One member from among the members of the State Board of Education;
 - (B) One member from the GEAR UP program in the chancellor's office; and
- 24 (C) One member from an admissions office of an Oregon University System school.
- 25 (e) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall appoint one member representing the 26 Department of Education.
- 27 (f) The chair of the Oregon Student Assistance Commission shall appoint one member 28 representing the ASPIRE program.
 - (2) For the purposes of this section, "under-represented demographic group" means:
 - (a) Minority students;

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(b) Low-income students;

- (c) Rural students; and
- (d) Potential first-generation college students.
 - (3) The task force shall:
 - (a) Investigate means of expanding the best practices of programs such as GEAR UP and ASPIRE to all Oregon students, with priority given to under-represented demographic groups;
 - (b) Include vocational schools and professional certification schools in its consideration of post-secondary education;
 - (c) Determine the earliest age when it is appropriate to begin introducing students and families to the idea of post-secondary education and recommend age-appropriate curricula; and
 - (d) Consider and recommend measures to accomplish the following goals:
 - (A) Development of strong partnerships with post-secondary schools for campus visitation opportunities and on-site informational sessions;
 - (B) Development of community partnerships to create student opportunities for connecting education with career goals;
 - (C) Assistance with post-secondary and financial aid application processes, including early education in such matters; and
 - (D) Efforts to inform and include parents in the post-secondary application process.
 - (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
 - (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
 - (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
 - (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
 - (10) The task force shall submit a report detailing its policy, curriculum and staff professional development recommendations along with estimated costs and proposed funding sources, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to post-secondary education no later than September 1, 2010.
 - (11) The Department of Education shall provide staff support to the task force. The department shall seek funding through a private partnership or a grant to offset task force related costs.
 - (12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to Department of Education for purposes of the task force.
 - (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating

1	to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force

3	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2009 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next

SECTION 3. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
