

Senate Bill 911

Sponsored by Senator STARR

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Department of Human Services to adopt rules applicable to secure community facilities housing persons under jurisdiction of Psychiatric Security Review Board.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to persons found guilty except for insanity.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Human Services shall adopt rules applicable to secure**
5 **residential treatment homes and facilities as defined in ORS 443.400 that house persons who,**
6 **as a condition of release under ORS 161.315 to 161.351, are required to live in a secure home**
7 **or facility. The rules must:**

8 (a) **Provide minimum security, health and safety standards;**

9 (b) **Require the home or facility to have an emergency preparedness plan;**

10 (c) **Set minimum training standards for the staff of the home or facility; and**

11 (d) **Ensure compliance with any orders of the court or the board.**

12 (2) **As used in this section, a residential treatment home or facility is "secure" if a resi-**
13 **dent exit from the home, facility or grounds of the home or facility is restricted through the**
14 **use of locking devices on resident exit doors, gates or other closures.**
