## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires Department of Human Services to adopt rules applicable to secure community facilities housing persons under jurisdiction of Psychiatric Security Review Board.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to persons found guilty except for insanity. 2 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Human Services shall adopt rules applicable to secure 4 residential treatment homes and facilities as defined in ORS 443.400 that house persons who, 5 as a condition of release under ORS 161.315 to 161.351, are required to live in a secure home 7 or facility. The rules must: 8 (a) Provide minimum security, health and safety standards; 9 (b) Require the home or facility to have an emergency preparedness plan; (c) Set minimum training standards for the staff of the home or facility; and 10 (d) Ensure compliance with any orders of the court or the board. 11 12 (2) As used in this section, a residential treatment home or facility is "secure" if a resi-13 dent exit from the home, facility or grounds of the home or facility is restricted through the use of locking devices on resident exit doors, gates or other closures. 14
