

Senate Bill 920

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program to receive State School Fund distribution.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program; creating new provisions; amend-
3 ing ORS 294.447 and 327.026; and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 327.026 is amended to read:

6 327.026. (1) In order to accomplish the purpose described in ORS 326.700, the State Board of
7 Education shall adopt by rule definitions and procedures to be applied to the computation of the
8 State School Fund allocations where necessary to make students enrolled in the Youth Corrections
9 Education Program, as defined in ORS 326.695, [*and*] the Juvenile Detention Education Program, as
10 defined in ORS 326.695, **and the Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program** equivalent
11 to students enrolled in common and union high school districts for purposes of distribution of the
12 fund.

13 (2)(a) The Youth Corrections Education Program shall be entitled to receive from the State
14 School Fund for each school year a special State School Fund grant, consisting of a general purpose
15 grant that is equal to the Youth Corrections Education Program ADM multiplied by 2.0 multiplied
16 by the additional per student weight, as defined in ORS 327.013 (7)(a)(A), multiplied by Funding
17 Percentage and further multiplied by Statewide Target per ADMw Grant.

18 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, the Youth Corrections Education Program
19 may not receive moneys under this section from the State School Fund for any youth in the program
20 who:

21 (A) Has received a high school diploma; or

22 (B) Is 21 years of age or older.

23 (3) The Juvenile Detention Education Program shall be entitled to receive from the State School
24 Fund for each school year a special State School Fund grant, consisting of a general purpose grant
25 that is equal to the Juvenile Detention Education Program ADM multiplied by 1.5 multiplied by
26 Funding Percentage and further multiplied by Statewide Target per ADMw Grant.

27 **(4) The Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program shall be entitled to receive**
28 **from the State School Fund for each school year a special State School Fund grant, con-**
29 **sisting of a general purpose grant that is equal to the Oregon National Guard Youth Chal-**

1 **lenge Program ADM multiplied by 2.0 multiplied by Funding Percentage and further**
 2 **multiplied by Statewide Target per ADMw Grant.**

3 [(4)] (5)(a) Funds allocated to the Youth Corrections Education Program and the Juvenile De-
 4 tention Education Program from the State School Fund shall remain with the Department of Edu-
 5 cation and shall be adjusted in the year following the distribution to reflect the actual ADMw of
 6 students in the Youth Corrections Education Program and the Juvenile Detention Education Pro-
 7 gram in the same manner as for the school districts under ORS 327.101.

8 **(b) Funds allocated to the Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program from the**
 9 **State School Fund shall be distributed to the program by the Department of Education fol-**
 10 **lowing the same percentages and dates specified for school districts under ORS 327.095 and**
 11 **shall be adjusted in the year following the distribution to reflect the actual ADMw of the**
 12 **students in the Oregon National Guard Youth Challenge Program in the same manner as for**
 13 **the school districts under ORS 327.101.**

14 **SECTION 2.** ORS 294.447 is amended to read:

15 294.447. (1) As used in this section "extended ADMw" means:

16 (a) For a school district the district extended ADMw as calculated under ORS 327.013.

17 (b) For an education service district the sum of the extended ADMw of the component school
 18 districts of the education service district.

19 (2) Notwithstanding ORS 294.445, a school district or education service district that uses the
 20 accrual basis method of accounting may include as accrued revenues in the budget and financial
 21 statement of the school district or education service district, for any fiscal year, an amount from the
 22 next fiscal year that is to be received in the next fiscal year. The amount accrued under this section
 23 may not be greater than the amount calculated under subsection (3)(b) or (c) of this section multi-
 24 plied by the extended ADMw of the school district or education service district.

25 (3)(a) For each fiscal year, the Department of Education shall calculate the amount available in
 26 the State School Fund for grants and distributions to school districts and the amount available for
 27 grants and distributions to education service districts under ORS 327.008, 327.013 and 327.019 based
 28 on the appropriations and allocations made to the State School Fund for that fiscal year by the
 29 Legislative Assembly in regular session. The department may not include in the amount calculated
 30 to be available for school districts under this paragraph the amounts received by the Youth Cor-
 31 rections Education Program, [and] the Juvenile Detention Education Program **and the Oregon**
 32 **National Guard Youth Challenge Program** under ORS 327.026 from the State School Fund.

33 (b) The department shall calculate for school districts an amount equal to (the amount calcu-
 34 lated under paragraph (a) of this subsection for school districts ÷ 12) ÷ the total statewide ex-
 35 tended ADMw of all school districts.

36 (c) The department shall calculate for education service districts an amount equal to (the
 37 amount calculated under paragraph (a) of this subsection for education service districts ÷ 12) ÷
 38 the total statewide extended ADMw of all education service districts.

39 (d) The department may adjust the calculations under this subsection based on current data for
 40 the factors used to calculate the State School Fund distribution to school districts and education
 41 service districts under ORS 327.008, 327.013 and 327.019.

42 (e) Notwithstanding paragraph (d) of this subsection, the department may not adjust the calcu-
 43 lation under paragraph (a) of this subsection based on changes made to the appropriations or allo-
 44 cations to the State School Fund by the Legislative Assembly in special session or by rule of the
 45 Oregon Department of Administrative Services relating to allotting funds.

1 (4) Notwithstanding ORS 294.445, a community college district or community college service
2 district that uses the accrual basis method of accounting may include as accrued revenues in the
3 budget and financial statement of the community college district or community college service dis-
4 trict, for any fiscal year, an amount from the next fiscal year that is to be received in the next fiscal
5 year. The amount accrued under this section may not be greater than 25 percent of the amount the
6 community college district or community college service district received as a Community College
7 Support Fund grant for the fiscal year for which the revenues are to be accrued.

8 **SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 294.447 and 327.026 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2009**
9 **Act apply to State School Fund distributions commencing with the 2009-2010 distribution.**

10 **SECTION 4. This 2009 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
11 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2009 Act takes effect**
12 **July 1, 2009.**
