SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

[Requires Department of Environmental Quality to create and implement Oregon Climate Corps to [Requires Department of Environmental Quality to create and implement Oregon Climate Corps to place individuals throughout Oregon to work on efforts to address climate change.] Requires Uni-versity of Oregon to implement Oregon Climate Corps through University of Oregon Insti-tute for Sustainable Environment Climate Masters program. Specifies types of projects to be included in program. [Requires individuals participating in program to pay fee to cover costs of training and placement.] Requires university to develop long-term plan to fund corps. Establishes Oregon Climate Corps Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to [depart-

ment] university to implement program.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to the Oregon Climate Corps; and appropriating money.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The University of Oregon, after consultation with the Oregon State Uni-
5	versity Extension Service, shall:
6	(a) Implement the Oregon Climate Corps through the University of Oregon Institute for
7	a Sustainable Environment Climate Masters program to help Oregon residents, businesses
8	and other entities increase their understanding of climate change, to reduce greenhouse gas
9	emissions and to address the climate change challenges that Oregon faces. The Oregon Cli-
10	mate Corps shall be a trained corps of volunteers to act as catalysts in support of the efforts
11	of public bodies as defined in ORS 174.109, the private sector and nongovernmental organ-
12	izations.
13	(b) Model the Oregon Climate Corps described in paragraph (a) of this subsection on
14	other successful public service programs, including but not limited to the Oregon State
15	University Master Gardener and Master Recycler programs, AmeriCorps and AmeriCorps
16	VISTA.
17	(2) Individuals participating in the Oregon Climate Corps shall work on projects meant
18	to address climate challenges, including but not limited to:
19	(a) Carbon sequestration projects such as local community tree-planting initiatives.
20	(b) Climate initiatives that emphasize affordable and easily implemented actions for
21	homes, local communities, private businesses, schools and public entities.
22	(c) Educational projects to increase the implementation of cost-effective, easily achieva-
23	ble changes in practices.
91	(d) Projects related to renewable energy technologies

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1 (e) Energy conservation and efficiency projects, such as home weatherization and the 2 installation of solar panels and other renewable energy technologies.

3 (f) Projects to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from transportation, from manufacturing
 4 and from food and produce use and acquisition.

(3)(a) The University of Oregon, after consultations with the Oregon State University
 Extension Service, shall develop a long-term plan to fund the Oregon Climate Corps.

(b) The University of Oregon may accept grants, donations, contribution or gifts from
any source for deposit in the Oregon Climate Corps Fund established under section 2 of this
2009 Act for expenditures for any purpose consistent with this section.

10 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Oregon Climate Corps Fund is established in the State Treasury, sepa-11 rate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the Oregon Climate Corps Fund 12 shall be credited to the fund. Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Uni-13 versity of Oregon for the purposes specified in section 1 of this 2009 Act.

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
