Senate Bill 954

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates crime of failure to report loss or theft of firearm. Punishes by maximum of 30 days' imprisonment, \$1,250 fine, or both.

Directs Oregon State Police to maintain registry of firearms lost or stolen in Oregon.

2	Relating to firearms.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) A person commits the crime of failure to report loss or theft of a firearm
5	if the person who owns or possesses a firearm as defined in ORS 166.210 fails to report the
6	loss or theft of the firearm within 48 hours of the time the person discovers or should have
7	discovered the loss or theft to a law enforcement agency having jurisdiction where the loss
8	or theft occurred or where the person making the report resides.
9	(2) Failure to report the loss or theft of a firearm is a Class C misdemeanor.
10	SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon State Police shall maintain a registry of firearms lost or
11	stolen in this state.
12	(2) The registry must include the following information:
13	(a) The make, model, caliber and manufacturer's number, if known, and other informa-
14	tion identifying the firearm;
15	(b) The date on which the loss or theft occurred or was discovered;
16	(c) The date on which the loss or theft was reported;
17	(d) The name, address and telephone number of the lawful owner; and
18	(e) The name, address and telephone number of the person who made the report under
19	section 1 of this 2009 Act.
20	SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2009 Act applies to conduct occurring on or after the ef-
21	fective date of this 2009 Act.
