Senate Joint Resolution 7

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution authorizing sobriety checkpoints for law enforcement purposes.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next primary election.

2	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
3	PARAGRAPH 1. Section 9, Article I of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended to
4	read:
5	Sec. 9. (1) No law shall violate the right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses,
6	papers, and effects, against unreasonable search, or seizure; and no warrant shall issue but upon
7	probable cause, supported by oath, or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be
8	searched, and the person or thing to be seized.[-]
9	(2) This section does not prohibit the use of sobriety checkpoints by law enforcement
10	officials.

12	PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the
13	people for their approval or rejection at a special election held throughout this state on the
14	same date as the next primary election.
