**Summary of Committee Action**

This bill directs the Department of Education to establish a pilot program to provide vision screenings to the greatest number of students practicable in grades 1 through 8. The agency is directed to report back to the next regular session of the Legislature on the results of the program.

The Committee appropriated \$150,000 General Fund to fund the provisions of this measure. Of this amount, \$144,041 is for contracted services and other incidental expenses. The remainder covers staff time in support of the program. The measure also establishes guidelines for the vision screenings and allows the Department to enter into a contract for implementation of the program.
