**EFFECTIVE DATE:** On passage.

**INTERIM JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS:** The budgetary impact of this bill was not reviewed and approved by the Interim Joint Committee on Ways and Means Committee and is not included in the omnibus budget bill to be introduced by the committee.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE:** This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**ANALYSIS:** This bill allows victims of crime to assert certain rights in some post conviction proceedings.

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Judiciary to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means. Under the measure's directives, notification to victims of their rights in certain post conviction proceedings, where they previously did not have those rights, would have a fiscal impact on the Department of Justice and other agencies. A detailed fiscal impact statement will be issued for the measure when it is considered by the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
