Updated Sponsors

House Bill 3623

Sponsored by Representatives BARTON, J SMITH, Senator ROSENBAUM; Representatives KOMP, MATTHEWS (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Liquor Control Commission to include informational materials regarding human trafficking with certain license renewal notices, if materials are supplied by nonprofit organization. Applies to license renewal notices that commission sends before January 1, 2012.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to human trafficking information; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) A nonprofit organization may supply to the Oregon Liquor Control 4 Commission copies of informational materials regarding human trafficking. The organization 5 may not charge the commission for the materials. The form of the materials may include, 6 but need not be limited to, adhesive stickers. The materials may not include information on 7 topics other than human trafficking. The materials must be limited in content to objectively 8 verifiable information, except that the materials may include logos, symbols, graphics or 9 10 similar devices and may include a cover letter to commission licensees urging the posting of stickers or other materials at the premises licensed by the commission. 11 (2) If a nonprofit organization supplies the commission with informational materials de-12 scribed in subsection (1) of this section, the commission shall include a copy of the materials 13

with each license renewal notice that the commission sends to an on-premises sales, offpremises sales or brewery-public house licensee. However, the number of copies of the materials that the commission sends to licensees may not exceed the number of copies that the nonprofit organization supplies to the commission.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2010 Act applies to license renewal notices that the Oregon
Liquor Control Commission sends to licensees on or after the effective date of this 2010 Act
and before January 1, 2012.

21 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 1 of this 2010 Act is repealed January 2, 2012.

22 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2010 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 23 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2010 Act takes effect 24 on its passage.

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
