SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Department of Education to establish pilot program for purpose of providing comprehensive vision screenings to students.

Sunsets June 30, 2011.

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Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to vision screenings; and declaring an emergency.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, "comprehensive vision screening" means an eye screening test for near visual acuity, distance visual acuity, hyperopia, depth fusion, near point of convergence, tracking and vertical imbalance.
 - (2)(a) The Department of Education shall establish a pilot program that is operated in three school districts in this state for the purpose of providing comprehensive vision screenings to students in those districts.
 - (b) The school districts participating in the pilot program must be of different sizes and geographic locations.
 - (c) The department may enter into a contract with a public or private entity to implement the pilot program.
 - (3) The department must ensure that at least 10,000 students in grades 1 through 8 from the school districts participating in the pilot program receive a comprehensive vision screening prior to January 1, 2011.
 - (4) Nothing in this section requires a student to participate in a comprehensive vision screening if the parent or guardian of the student provides a statement that the comprehensive vision screening is contrary to the religious beliefs of the student or of the parent or guardian of the student.
 - (5) The department may accept contributions of funds and assistance from the United States Government and its agencies or from any other source, public or private, and agree to conditions placed on the funds that are not inconsistent with the purposes of this section.
- (6) All funds received by the department for the pilot program shall be paid into the Department of Education Account established by ORS 326.115 to the credit of the pilot program.
- (7) Not later than March 1, 2011, the department shall report the results of the pilot program to the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly, including:
 - (a) The number of students who received a comprehensive vision screening;

- (b) The number of students who were identified as requiring vision correction or treatment as a result of the comprehensive vision screening, and the types of vision correction and treatment required;
 (c) The number of students identified as requiring vision correction or treatment who received vision correction or treatment;
 (d) The estimated cost per student for the students who received a comprehensive vision
 - (d) The estimated cost per student for the students who received a comprehensive vision screening; and
 - (e) Recommendations for how to fund and implement statewide a program that provides students with a comprehensive vision screening.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2010 Act is repealed on June 30, 2011.
 - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2010 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2010 Act takes effect on its passage.
