House Bill 3662

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes Committee on Prescribing Psychologists and authorizes committee to issue certificate of prescriptive authority to certain licensed psychologists, limit drugs that may be prescribed and make recommendations to State Board of Psychologist Examiners.

Specifies requirements for certificate of prescriptive authority.

Directs board to establish standards and continuing education requirements for prescribing psychologists.

Imposes certain requirements on psychologists who prescribe drugs for children. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. ORS 675.010 is amended to read: $\mathbf{5}$

675.010. As used in ORS 675.010 to 675.150, unless the context requires otherwise: 6

7 (1) "Approved doctoral program in psychology" means a doctoral program in psychology ac-

credited by the American Psychological Association or a doctoral program in psychology accredited 8

individually or as part of an institutional accreditation by another private or governmental accred-9

iting agency, when the association's or agency's standards and procedures have been approved by 10

the State Board of Psychologist Examiners by rule. 11

(2) "Collaboration" means a process that involves two or more persons working together,

each contributing that person's respective area of expertise to provide more comprehensive 14 care than one person alone can provide. 15

(3) "Distribution" means the delivery of a drug other than by administering or dispens-16 ing, such as delivery of prepackaged samples of a drug. 17

(4) "Drug" means an article, other than food: 18

(a) Intended for use in the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment or prevention of mental 19 20 and emotional disorders; and

(b) Intended to affect a structure or function of the human body.

22[(3)] (5) "Licensed psychologist" means a person licensed to practice psychology under the pro-23visions of ORS 675.010 to 675.150.

[(4)] (6) "Practice of psychology" means rendering or offering to render supervision, consulta-24 tion, evaluation or therapy services to individuals, groups or organizations for the purpose of diag-25 26 nosing or treating behavioral, emotional or mental disorders. "Practice of psychology" also includes 27delegating the administration and scoring of tests to technicians qualified by and under the direct supervision of a licensed psychologist. 28

(7) "Prescribe" has the meaning given that term in ORS 677.010. 1 2 (8) "Prescribing psychologist" means a licensed psychologist who has been issued a certificate of prescriptive authority by the Committee on Prescribing Psychologists under sec-3 tion 4 of this 2010 Act. 4 (9) "Prescribing psychologist formulary" means the list of drugs and the protocols for 5 their use adopted by the Committee on Prescribing Psychologists under section 3 of this 2010 6 7 Act. [(5)] (10) "State" means any state or territory of the United States and the District of Columbia. 8 9 SECTION 2. Sections 3 to 7 of this 2010 Act are added to and made a part of ORS 675.010 to 675.150. 10 SECTION 3. (1) There is established a Committee on Prescribing Psychologists under the 11 12jurisdiction of the State Board of Psychologist Examiners. The term of office for each member is three years, but each member serves at the pleasure of the appointing authority. 13 Before the expiration of the term of a member, the appointing authority shall appoint a 14 15 successor whose term begins on July 1 next following. A member is eligible for reappoint-16 ment. (c) The State Board of Pharmacy shall appoint one person who is a pharmacist licensed 32by the State Board of Pharmacy or who has an advanced degree in pharmacology or 33 34 pharmacognosy. 35 (3) The committee shall: (a) Develop and establish the prescribing psychologist formulary and annual formulary 36 37 revisions; and 38 (b) Evaluate and develop recommendations regarding: (A) Requirements for supervised clinical training for prescribing psychologists; 39 (B) Requirements for the education and training of prescribing psychologists treating 40 special populations; and 41 (C) Continuing education for prescribing psychologists. 42 (4) The committee may consult with persons engaged in other professions, as needed, for 43 assistance in areas outside the expertise of the committee. 44 SECTION 4. 4 <u>SECTION 10.</u> The State Board of Psychologist Examiners and the Committee on Pre-5 scribing Psychologists may accept gifts, grants or contributions from any public or private 6 source for the purpose of carrying out sections 3 to 7 of this 2010 Act.

SECTION 11. The Committee on Prescribing Psychologists shall report to the Legislative
 Assembly or an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to the practice of
 psychology by January 31, 2012, the committee's evaluation and recommendations on the
 topics listed in section 3 (3) of this 2010 Act.

11 SECTION 12. Sections 4, 5, 6 and 7 of this 2010 Act become operative on June 30, 2012.

<u>SECTION 13.</u> (1) The State Board of Psychologist Examiners may take any action before the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2010 Act that is necessary for the board to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2010 Act, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the board by sections 6 and 7 of this 2010 Act.

(2) The Committee on Prescribing Psychologists may take any action before the operative
date specified in section 12 of this 2010 Act that is necessary for the committee to exercise,
on and after the operative date specified in section 12 of this 2010 Act, all of the duties,
functions and powers conferred on the committee by sections 4 and 5 of this 2010 Act.

20 <u>SECTION 14.</u> This 2010 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 21 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2010 Act takes effect 22 on its passage.
