

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 5100

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “administration;” insert “creating new provisions;
2 amending section 2, chapter 676, Oregon Laws 2009, and section 20, chapter 910, Oregon Laws 2009;
3 repealing section 45, chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2009, and section 2, chapter 910, Oregon Laws
4 2009;”.

5 Delete lines 5 through 28 and delete pages 2 through 6 and insert:

6 **“SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
7 **expenditures established by section 3, chapter 673, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium be-**
8 **ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds col-**
9 **lected or received by the Department of Justice, is increased by \$1,531,744 for investigating**
10 **and prosecuting drug trafficking organizations and gang violence.**

11 **“(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures**
12 **established by section 3, chapter 673, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,**
13 **2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received**
14 **by the Department of Justice, is increased by \$1,603,405 for federal grants relating to reduc-**
15 **ing mortgage fraud, investigating and prosecuting individuals who target children on the**
16 **Internet, reducing violence against women and paying medical and other costs related to**
17 **victims of person crimes.**

18 **“(3) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures**
19 **established by section 2, chapter 673, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,**
20 **2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,**
21 **including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or**
22 **received by the Department of Justice, is increased by \$510,000 for costs related to training,**
23 **investigating and prosecuting issues related to domestic abuse.**

24 **“(4) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures**
25 **established by section 2, chapter 673, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,**
26 **2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,**
27 **including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or**
28 **received by the Department of Justice, is increased by \$337,265 for the processing and col-**
29 **lecting of revenue for crime victims’ programs.**

30 **“SECTION 2. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Department**
31 **of Justice from the Department of Justice Protection and Education Revolving Account un-**
32 **der ORS 180.095 (1)(a) for payments of restitution and refunds are not limited.**

33 **“SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
34 **expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 680, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium**
35 **beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds**

collected or received by the State Parks and Recreation Department, is increased by \$122,500 for a forest fuels reduction project in Collier Memorial State Park in Klamath County.

“**SECTION 4.** (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Emergency Board by section 5, chapter 730, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for allocation to the State Forestry Department for fire protection expenses, is decreased by \$2,137,020.

“(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the State Forestry Department by section 1 (2), chapter 730, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$2,137,020 for costs associated with contracting for large air tankers and helicopters to supplement fire suppression resources for the 2009 fire season.

“**SECTION 5.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 20 (2), chapter 910, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Judicial Department, is increased by \$1,343,662 for electronic court.

“**SECTION 6.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the authorized appropriations and expenditure limitations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for the Department of Human Services are changed by the amounts specified:

6 **“SECTION 7.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
7 expenditures established by section 2, chapter 663, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium be-
8 ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
9 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, and including federal funds received from
10 the Department of Human Services for family preservation and support and other services
11 supporting children and families, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described
12 in this section, collected or received by the State Commission on Children and Families, is
13 increased by \$938,274 for expenditures related to private foundation grants for Reconnecting
14 Foster Youth with Families and for Reading for Healthy Families.

15 **“SECTION 8.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
16 expenditures established by section 5, chapter 665, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium be-
17 ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other
18 than those described in section 3, chapter 665, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the
19 Employment Department, is increased by \$1,250,000 for expenditures related to labor market
20 information enhancement.

21 **“SECTION 9.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
22 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 671, Oregon Laws 2009, as the maximum
23 limit for payment of expenses and debt service, from fees, moneys or other revenues, in-
24 cluding Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds from the United States Department of
25 Housing and Urban Development for contract services, but excluding lottery funds and fed-
26 eral funds not described in this section, collected or received by the Housing and Community
27 Services Department, is increased by \$131,163 for operations.

28 **“SECTION 10.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
29 expenditures established by section 4, chapter 671, Oregon Laws 2009, as the maximum limit
30 for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those described in sections 2 and 5,
31 chapter 671, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the Housing and Community Services
32 Department, is increased by \$20,452,513 for expenditures related to cash grants exchanged for
33 or in lieu of federal low-income housing tax credits as authorized by section 1602 of the
34 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (P.L. 111-5).

35 **“(2)** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
36 established by section 4, chapter 671, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,
37 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those
38 described in sections 2 and 5, chapter 671, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the
39 Housing and Community Services Department, is increased by \$6,829,635 for expenditures
40 related to administration of the Neighborhood Stabilization Program grant from the United
41 States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

42 **“SECTION 11.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
43 expenditures established by section 1 (1), chapter 116, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
44 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
45 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal

1 funds, collected or received by the Public Utility Commission of Oregon, is increased by
2 \$222,361 for implementation of portions of the Enhancing State Government Energy Assur-
3 ance Capabilities and Planning for Smart Grid Resiliency Initiative grant awarded by the
4 United States Department of Energy.

5 “(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
6 established by section 2, chapter 116, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,
7 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received
8 by the Public Utility Commission of Oregon, is increased by \$416,474 for expenditures related
9 to the Oregon Electricity Regulators Assistance Project.

10 “SECTION 12. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
11 expenditures established by section 1 (15), chapter 739, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
12 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
13 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and federal funds received as reimburse-
14 ment from the United States Department of Transportation, but excluding lottery funds and
15 federal funds not described in this section, collected or received by the Department of
16 Transportation, is increased by \$700,000 for transportation work zone safety patrol grants.

17 “(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
18 established by section 2 (5), chapter 739, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July
19 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those
20 described in section 1, chapter 739, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the Depart-
21 ment of Transportation, is increased by \$2,000,000 for transportation safety grants.

22 “SECTION 13. (1) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Oregon
23 Department of Administrative Services for the federal funds debt service on Build America
24 Bonds are not limited.

25 “(2) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Department of Human
26 Services for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

27 “(3) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Oregon Military De-
28 partment for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

29 “(4) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Oregon Youth Author-
30 ity for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

31 “(5) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Department of Com-
32 munity Colleges and Workforce Development for the federal funds debt service on Build
33 America Bonds are not limited.

34 “(6) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Oregon University
35 System for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

36 “(7) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Department of Trans-
37 portation for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

38 “(8) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the State Department of
39 Energy for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

40 “(9) For the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, expenditures by the Department of Cor-
41 rections for the federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds are not limited.

42 “SECTION 14. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
43 expenditures established by section 3, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium be-
44 ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other
45 than those described in sections 4 and 5, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received

1 by the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development, is increased by
2 \$2,153,427 for a State Energy Sector Partnership and Training grant.

3 “(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
4 established by section 4, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,
5 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds other than those
6 described in section 5, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the Depart-
7 ment of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for the Oregon Youth Conserva-
8 tion Corps, is increased by \$3,125,000 for the Oregon Youth Employment Initiative.

9 “(3) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
10 established by section 2 (1), chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July
11 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,
12 including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds and those funds
13 described in section 6, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the Depart-
14 ment of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for the Department of Community
15 Colleges and Workforce Development, is increased by \$478,460 for a State Labor Market In-
16 formation Improvement Grant.

17 “SECTION 15. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
18 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 721, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
19 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
20 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
21 funds, collected or received by the Oregon Business Development Department for business,
22 innovation and trade, is decreased by \$18,989.

23 “(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
24 established by section 2 (2), chapter 721, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July
25 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,
26 including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or
27 received by the Oregon Business Development Department, is increased by \$531,520 for
28 infrastructure financing.

29 “(3) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
30 established by section 4 (1), chapter 721, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July
31 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or re-
32 ceived by the Oregon Business Development Department for business, innovation and trade,
33 is increased by \$5,000,000 for federal grants relating to development of a biomass utilization
34 project in Grant County.

35 “SECTION 16. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
36 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
37 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
38 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
39 funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections, is increased by \$760,781 for
40 education, treatment and other services provided to offenders.

41 “(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
42 established by section 3, chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,
43 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received
44 by the Department of Corrections, is increased by \$1,362,077 for services related to workplace
45 and community transition training and for the costs of incarcerating illegal aliens.

1 **“SECTION 17.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
2 \$700,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for
3 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
4 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of
5 Corrections for capital improvements, including repair of the wastewater treatment system
6 at the Deer Ridge Correctional Institution and installation of a solar water heating system
7 at the Eastern Oregon Correctional Institution.

8 **“SECTION 18.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
9 expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 862, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
10 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
11 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
12 funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, is increased by \$60,000 for
13 forensic services requested by Western Oregon University.

14 **“SECTION 19.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
15 expenditures established by section 1 (1), chapter 736, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
16 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
17 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
18 funds, collected or received by the Department of State Lands, is increased by \$1,268,061 for
19 expenses related to the Portland Harbor.

20 **“SECTION 20.** (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is ap-
21 propriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the
22 General Fund, the amount of \$2,825,910, to be allocated to the Department of State Lands for
23 expenses related to expert witness fees for the Portland Harbor.

24 **“(2)** If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated
25 by the Emergency Board prior to December 1, 2010, the moneys remaining on that date be-
26 come available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.

27 **“SECTION 21.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
28 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 736, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
29 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds
30 collected or received by the Department of State Lands, is increased by \$39,700 for Natural
31 Heritage Advisory Council grant-supported projects.

32 **“SECTION 22.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
33 expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 643, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
34 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
35 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, and including federal funds for contract
36 services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 643,
37 Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the State Department of Agriculture, is increased
38 by \$397,081.

39 **“(2)** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
40 established by section 2 (4), chapter 643, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July
41 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,
42 including Miscellaneous Receipts, and including federal funds for contract services, but ex-
43 cluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 643, Oregon Laws
44 2009, collected or received by the State Department of Agriculture, is increased by \$108,796
45 for costs related to management oversight of commodity inspections.

1 “(3) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made
2 to the State Department of Agriculture by section 1 (2), chapter 643, Oregon Laws 2009, for
3 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for food safety, is decreased by \$400,000.

4 “(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made
5 to the State Department of Agriculture by section 1 (3), chapter 643, Oregon Laws 2009, for
6 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for natural resources is increased by \$225,000.

7 “SECTION 23. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
8 expenditures established by section 3, chapter 157, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium be-
9 ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
10 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
11 funds, collected or received by the Board of Naturopathic Examiners, is increased by \$49,781
12 for the purpose of conducting investigations.

13 “SECTION 24. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appro-
14 priation made to the Emergency Board by section 2 (1), chapter 646, Oregon Laws 2009, for
15 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for allocation to the Columbia River Gorge Commission
16 for operating expenses, is decreased by \$25,000.

17 “(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made
18 to the Columbia River Gorge Commission by section 1 (1), chapter 646, Oregon Laws 2009, for
19 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$25,000 for the joint operating program.

20 “SECTION 25. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
21 expenditures established by section 2 (4), chapter 862, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
22 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
23 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
24 funds, collected or received by the Department of State Police, is increased by \$2,096,756 for
25 costs of replacing the Computer Aided Dispatch System and the Records Management Sys-
26 tem.

27 “SECTION 26. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
28 expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 685, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium
29 beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or
30 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal
31 funds, collected or received by the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training for
32 operations, is increased by \$706,000 for costs of additional basic law enforcement classes.

33 “SECTION 27. There is appropriated to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, for
34 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,508,135 for
35 deposit in the Fish and Wildlife Deferred Maintenance Subaccount established under ORS
36 496.303 (7).

37 “SECTION 28. Section 2, chapter 676, Oregon Laws 2009, is amended to read:

38 “**Sec. 2.** *[Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$4,575,874 is estab-*
39 *lished for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from*
40 *fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and fed-*
41 *eral funds, collected or received by the Legislative Administration Committee.] Notwithstanding any*
42 **other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium be-**
43 **ginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or**
44 **other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal**
45 **funds, collected or received by the Legislative Administration Committee for the following**

purposes:

(1) Operations..... \$ 2,798,440

(2) Debt Service..... \$ 2,000,000

“SECTION 29. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development by section 1 (4), chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for debt service on the outstanding general obligation bonds sold pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, is increased by \$350,000.

“(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (3), chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds and those funds described in section 6, chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, collected or received by the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for debt service, is decreased by \$350,000.

“SECTION 30. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (4), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for community corrections, is increased by \$103,784,840.

“(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Department of Corrections by section 1 (1), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for operations and health services, is decreased by \$103,784,840.

“(3) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 860, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections for administration, public services and general services, is decreased by \$1,425,912 for deferred maintenance project management staff.

“SECTION 31. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Department of State Police by section 1 (1), chapter 862, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for patrol services, criminal investigations and gaming enforcement, is increased by \$8,088,305 for new trooper positions.

“SECTION 32. Section 45, chapter 660, Oregon Laws 2009, is repealed.

“SECTION 33. 19 “SECTION 100. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-

22 decreased by \$7,810.

23 “SECTION 101. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-
24 ation made to the State Forestry Department by section 1 (4), chapter 730, Oregon Laws
25 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, for debt service is decreased by \$23,778.

26 “SECTION 102. This 2010 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
27 public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2010 Act takes
28 effect on its passage.”.
