SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1059

On page 1 of the printed bill, line 4, delete "7" and insert "8". 1 Delete lines 6 through 14 and insert: "SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Transportation Commission, after consultation with and in 3 cooperation with metropolitan planning organizations, other state agencies, local govern-4 5 ments and stakeholders, as a part of the state transportation policy developed and maintained under ORS 184.618, shall adopt a statewide transportation strategy on greenhouse gas 6 7 emissions to aid in achieving the greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals set forth in ORS 468A.205. The commission shall focus on reducing greenhouse gas emissions resulting from 8 9 transportation. In developing the strategy, the commission shall take into account state and 10 federal programs, policies and incentives related to reducing greenhouse gas emissions. "(2) The commission shall actively solicit public review and comment in the development 11 12 of the strategy.". 13 In line 16, delete "in consultation" and insert "after consultation with and in cooperation". 14 In line 17, after "agencies" insert ", local governments" and delete "adopt rules establishing" and insert "establish". 15 16 In line 19, after "must" insert ", at a minimum". 17 On page 2, line 3, after the comma delete the rest of the line and insert "after consultation with 18 and in cooperation with metropolitan planning organizations, local governments and other". 19 In line 4, delete "adopt rules establishing" and insert "establish". 20 In line 25, after "(1)" insert "Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section,". 21 In line 26, after the comma delete the rest of the line and insert "after consultation with and 22 in cooperation with the Oregon Transportation Commission, local governments and metropolitan". 23 In line 27, after "rules" insert "identifying a reduction target for" and delete the rest of the line. 24 Delete lines 28 and 29. 25 In line 30, delete "in". 26 In line 31, after "less" insert "to be met by each region served by a metropolitan planning or-27 ganization". 28 In line 34, after the period insert "The rules must also take into consideration methods of 29 equitably allocating reductions among the metropolitan areas given differences in population growth rates.". 30 31 On page 3, line 18, delete "should" and insert "need to". 32 In line 24, after "by" insert "each region served by" and delete the rest of the line. 33 In line 25, delete "ries of". In line 30, after "each" insert "region served by" and delete the rest of the line. 34

In line 31, delete "aries of".

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Delete lines 40 through 45 and delete pages 4 and 5 and insert:

"(3) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to the region served by the metropolitan planning organization that serves Portland.

"SECTION 6. The Department of Transportation and the Department of Land Conservation and Development, after consultation with and in cooperation with other state agencies and the Oregon University System, shall:

- "(1) Educate the public about the need to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from motor vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less; and
- "(2) Educate the public about the costs and benefits of reducing greenhouse gas emissions.
- "SECTION 7. (1) As used in this section, 'regional transportation plan' means a longrange transportation plan prepared and adopted by a metropolitan planning organization for a metropolitan area as provided for in federal law.
- "(2) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, the local governments within the boundaries of a metropolitan planning organization, after consultation with and in cooperation with the metropolitan planning organization and state agencies, shall:
- "(a) Consider whether any immediate action can be taken to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- "(b) Consider how regional transportation plans could be altered to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- "(3) Subsection (2) of this section does not apply to the metropolitan planning organization that serves Portland or to the local governments within that metropolitan planning organization.
- "SECTION 8. The Department of Transportation and the Department of Land Conservation and Development, after consultation with and in cooperation with local governments within the boundaries of a metropolitan planning organization, shall make a joint report to the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in ORS 192.245. The report must provide information regarding the amount of financing that is necessary to cover the costs of local governments in preparing and cooperatively selecting land use and transportation scenarios and the potential sources of funding for this preparation and cooperative selection.
- "SECTION 9. The Department of Transportation and the Department of Land Conservation and Development shall make a joint report to the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, regarding:
 - "(1) The progress made in developing:
- "(a) The statewide transportation strategy on greenhouse gas emissions adopted by the Oregon Transportation Commission pursuant to section 2 of this 2010 Act;
- "(b) The guidelines established by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Land Conservation and Development pursuant to section 3 of this 2010 Act; and
- "(c) The toolkit established by the Department of Transportation and the Department of Land Conservation and Development pursuant to section 4 of this 2010 Act.
- "(2) Recommendations on how to meet the greenhouse gas emissions reduction targets identified in section 5 of this 2010 Act.
- "(3) Whether additional actions or a different framework is necessary to carry out the greenhouse gas emissions reduction goals set forth in ORS 468A.205.

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"SECTION 10. Section 2 of this 2010 Act does not limit the authority of an agency, as defined in ORS 183.310, to regulate air contaminants.

"SECTION 11. This 2010 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2010 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
