SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Increases for six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, limits on payment of expenses from other funds collected or received by Department of Human Services and Department of Veterans' Affairs for capital construction.

Establishes and modifies limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, on payment of expenses from bond proceeds and other revenues, including federal funds, collected or received by Oregon University System for capital construction.

Sets expiration date on project approvals and expenditure limitations.

Adopts legislative findings regarding eligibility of Oregon Center for Sustainability for Article XI-F(1) bonding financing.

Establishes and modifies, for specified six-year periods, limits on payment of expenses from fees, moneys and other revenues, including federal funds, collected or received by specified state agencies for specified purposes.

Extends expiration date of project approval and expenditure limitations by Legislative Assembly for Lane County Armed Forces Reserve Center Complex.

Extends, from two-year period beginning July 1, 2009, to six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, expenditure limit on payment of expenses from bond proceeds collected or received by Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for specified purposes.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to state financial administration; creating new provisions; amending section 2, chapter 761,
3 Oregon Laws 2007, and sections 6, 8, 9, 10, 20 and 37, chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009; limiting
4 expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

5 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

6 **SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on**
7 **expenditures established by section 1 (4), chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, for a six-year period**
8 **beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses from fees, moneys**
9 **or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal**
10 **funds, collected or received by the Department of Human Services for the acquisition of land**
11 **and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of**
12 **the Oregon State Hospital is increased by \$10,000.**

13 **SECTION 2. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
14 **\$964,714 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for**
15 **the payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-**
16 **ceipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department**
17 **of Veterans' Affairs for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing,**
18 **altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the Oregon Veterans' Home Multipurpose**
19 **Area.**

NOTE: Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter *[italic and bracketed]* is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

(2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$1,791,611 is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Veterans' Affairs for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the Oregon Veterans' Home Multipurpose Area.

SECTION 3. Section 6, chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, is amended to read:

Sec. 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses under this section from bond proceeds and other revenues, including federal funds, collected or received by the [Department of Higher Education] **Oregon University System**, for the acquisition of land, improvements to land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings, facilities and other projects within the [Department of Higher Education] **Oregon University System**:

Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses under this section from bond proceeds and other revenues, including federal funds, collected or received by the [Department of Higher Education] **Oregon University System**, for the acquisition of land, improvements to land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings, facilities and other projects within the [Department of Higher Education] **Oregon University System**:

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18 **SECTION 5.** Section 8, chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, is amended to read:

19 **Sec. 8. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section,** notwithstanding any other
 20 provision of *[this 2009 Act,]* **chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009,** the bond proceeds and other revenues,
 21 including federal funds, the expenditures from which are limited by section 6 *[of this 2009 Act],*
 22 **chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009,** are not available for expenditure before *[the effective date of this*
 23 *2009 Act]* **August 4, 2009.** However, any action taken by the State Board of Higher Education prior
 24 to *[the effective date of this 2009 Act]* **August 4, 2009,** or any contract entered into by the board prior
 25 to *[the effective date of this 2009 Act]* **August 4, 2009,** necessary for the acquisition of and improve-
 26 ments to land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equip-
 27 ping of buildings and facilities authorized by *[this 2009 Act]* **chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009,** is

28 (3) In compliance with the requirements of Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, funds
 29 available under the expenditure limitation for bonds issued pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon
 30 Constitution in section 6 (1)(d) [*of this 2009 Act*], **chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009**, are matched with
 31 the General Fund appropriation made under section 15 [*of this 2009 Act*], **chapter 904, Oregon**
 32 **Laws 2009**.

33 (4) In compliance with the requirements of Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, funds
 34 available under the expenditure limitation for bonds issued pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon

 19 available under the expenditure limitation for bonds issued pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon

 21 the General Fund appropriation made under section 22 *[of this 2009 Act]*, **chapter 904, Oregon**

 24 available under the expenditure limitation for bonds issued pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon

 26 the General Fund appropriation made under section 23 *[of this 2009 Act]*, **chapter 904, Oregon**

28 (12) In compliance with the requirements of Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, funds
 29 available under the expenditure limitation for bonds issued pursuant to Article XI-G of the Oregon
 30 Constitution in section 6 (7)(a) *[of this 2009 Act]*, **chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009**, are matched with
 31 the General Fund appropriation made under section 24 *[of this 2009 Act]*, **chapter 904, Oregon**
 32 **Laws 2009**.

33 **SECTION 8.** Section 20, chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, is amended to read:

34 **Sec. 20.** (1) There is established in the General Fund an account to be known as the Oregon
 35 State University Bates Hall/Hallie Ford Healthy Children and Families Center Project Account.
 36 Funds in the account shall be used for the construction, remodeling, expansion and renovation of
 37 facilities for a facility project at Oregon State University.

38 (2) The account shall consist of proceeds from grant funds, gift funds and federal and local
 39 government funds made available to the *[Department of Higher Education]* **Oregon University Sys-**
 40 **tem** for the purpose of the facility project described in subsection (1) of this section. Interest earned
 41 on moneys in the account shall be credited to the account. The account may not be credited with
 42 more than *[\$6,000,000]* **\$5,000,000** for purposes of this subsection.

43 (3) Moneys in the account shall be considered to be General Fund moneys for purposes of sec-
 44 tion 1 (3), Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution, are continuously appropriated to the *[Department*
 45 *of Higher Education]* **Oregon University System** and may be transferred to the *[Department of*

1 *Higher Education Capital Construction Fund*] account designated by ORS 351.626 for the facility
2 project described in subsection (1) of this section.

3 **SECTION 9.** (1) In approving bond financing under Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon Consti-
4 tution for the Oregon Center for Sustainability as provided in section 6 (1)(c), chapter 904,
5 Oregon Laws 2009, the Legislative Assembly finds that:

6 (a) The Oregon Center for Sustainability will be designed as a living, net zero building
7 that will demonstrate how such a building operates and how tenants respond to such a
8 building;

9 (b) The Oregon University System will reserve the right for its students and faculty to
10 study the construction and operation of the Oregon Center for Sustainability and the use of
11 the center by its tenants;

12 (c) The students and faculty of the Oregon University System will benefit from the op-
13 portunities to study the construction, operation and use of the Oregon Center for
14 Sustainability, to interact with tenants involved in sustainable enterprises and to observe
15 and participate in ongoing research projects involving the building tenants; and

16 (d) The Oregon Center for Sustainability is a project that furthers higher education and
17 the statutory purposes of the Oregon University System, even though the center may be
18 occupied primarily by private tenants that do not directly provide higher education services.

19 (2) For the reasons described in subsection (1) of this section, the Legislative Assembly
20 determines that the Oregon Center for Sustainability is a project for higher education in
21 Oregon that is eligible for financing under Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon Constitution. The
22 Oregon University System is authorized to construct and operate the center and to lease any
23 space in the center to other entities in a manner that the State Board of Higher Education
24 determines will further the interests of the Oregon University System.

25 **SECTION 10.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
26 \$900,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for
27 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts,
28 but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of
29 Corrections for replacing irrigation wells on the property referred to as the Mill Creek
30 property in Salem.

31 **SECTION 11.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
32 expenditures established by section 1 (5)(a), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for a six-year
33 period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses from fees,
34 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and
35 federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Corrections for deferred mainte-
36 nance and assessment project management staff is increased by \$1,425,912.

37 **SECTION 12.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
38 expenditures established by section 1 (1)(b), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for a six-year
39 period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses from fees,
40 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and
41 federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Transportation for the acquisition
42 of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equip-
43 ping of the Transportation Building is increased by \$64,733,792.

44 **SECTION 13.** (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
45 \$12,100,000 is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit

1 for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department
2 for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing,
3 furnishing and equipping of the Polk County Readiness Center.

4 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
5 established by section 7, chapter 26, Oregon Laws 2009, for the six-year period beginning July
6 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues,
7 including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or
8 received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land in Dallas, Oregon,
9 and for the construction of a new Polk County Readiness Center to replace the existing
10 Dallas Armory is increased by \$5,580,960.

11 (3) Any reference in section 7, chapter 26, Oregon Laws 2009, to the Dallas Readiness
12 Center is considered a reference to the Polk County Readiness Center.

13 SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
14 expenditures established by section 1 (9)(c), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for a six-year
15 period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses from fees,
16 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and
17 federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition
18 of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equip-
19 ping of the Woodburn Armory Addition/Alteration is decreased by \$3,145,057.

20 SECTION 15. (1) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
21 expenditures established by section 1 (7)(b), chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, for a six-year
22 period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses from fees,
23 moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and
24 federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition
25 of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equip-
26 ping of the Hood River Armory is decreased by \$1,358,762.

27 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures
28 established by section 1 (7)(c), chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, for a six-year period beginning
29 July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for the payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other
30 revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds,
31 collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the
32 acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the
33 Milton-Freewater Armory is decreased by \$961,407.

34 SECTION 16. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on
35 expenditures established by section 2 (1)(a), chapter 742, Oregon Laws 2007, for a six-year
36 period beginning July 1, 2007, as the maximum limit for the expenditure of federal funds
37 collected or received by the Oregon Military Department for the acquisition of land and the
38 acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of the
39 Ontario Readiness Center is increased by \$265,000.

40 SECTION 17. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
41 \$619,000 is established for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit
42 for the expenditure of federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Military Department
43 for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing,
44 furnishing and equipping of a high-voltage electrical loop project at Camp Rilea.

45 SECTION 18. The expiration date of the project approvals and expenditure limitations

1 **authorized by the Legislative Assembly for the Oregon Military Department for the Lane**
 2 **County Armed Forces Reserve Center Complex is extended to June 30, 2011.**

3 **SECTION 19.** Section 37, chapter 904, Oregon Laws 2009, is amended to read:
